2	relating to security in public schools.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 37.108 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 37.108. MULTI-HAZARD EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN;
7	SECURITY AUDIT. (a) Each school district shall adopt and implement
8	a multi-hazard emergency operations plan that addresses
9	mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as recommended by
10	the Federal Emergency Management Agency for use in district
11	schools. The plan must provide for:
12	(1) district employee training in responding to an
13	<pre>emergency;</pre>
14	(2) mandatory school drills to prepare district
15	students and employees for responding to an emergency;
16	(3) measures to ensure coordination with local
17	emergency management agencies, law enforcement, and fire
18	departments in the event of an emergency; and
19	(4) the implementation of a security audit as required
20	by Subsection (b).
21	(b) At least once every three years, a school district shall
22	conduct a security audit of the district's facilities. To the
23	extent possible, a district shall follow a safety and security
24	audit procedure developed by the Texas School Safety Center or a

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1	comparable entity.
2	(c) A school district shall report the results of the
3	security audit conducted under Subsection (b) to the district's
4	board of trustees.
5	SECTION 2. Section 37.205, Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 37.205. SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS. The center shall
8	conduct for school districts a safety training program that
9	includes:
10	(1) development of a positive school environment and
11	proactive safety measures designed to address local concerns;
12	(2) school safety courses for law enforcement
13	officials, with a focus on school district police officers and
14	<pre>school resource officers;</pre>
15	(3) discussion of school safety issues with parents
16	and community members; [and]
17	(4) specialized training for the staff of <u>disciplinary</u>
18	alternative education programs and juvenile justice alternative
19	education programs; and
20	(5) assistance in developing a multi-hazard emergency
21	operations plan for adoption under Section 37.108.
22	SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
23	amended by adding Section 37.2051 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 37.2051. SECURITY CRITERIA FOR INSTRUCTIONAL
25	FACILITIES. The center shall develop security criteria that school
26	districts may consider in the design of instructional facilities.
27	SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 46, Education Code, is

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amended by adding Section 46.0081 to read as follows: 1 2 Sec. 46.0081. SECURITY CRITERIA IN DESIGN OF INSTRUCTIONAL FACILITIES. A school district that constructs a new instructional 3 4 facility or conducts a major renovation of an existing instructional facility using funds allotted to the district under 5 6 this subchapter shall consider, in the design of the instructional facility, security criteria developed by the Texas School Safety 7 8 Center under Section 37.2051. SECTION 5. (a) Not later than December 1, 2005, the Texas 9 10 School Safety Center shall: (1) develop a school safety program that includes 11 assistance to school districts in developing a multi-hazard 12 emergency operations plan as required by Section 37.205, Education 13 14 Code, as amended by this Act; and 15 (2) develop security criteria for the construction and 16 renovation of school district instructional facilities as required by Section 37.2051, Education Code, as added by this Act. 17 Not later than March 1, 2006, each school district shall 18 (b) adopt a multi-hazard emergency operations plan as required by 19 Section 37.108, Education Code, as added by this Act. 20 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
