4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 54.0514 to read as follows:
- Sec. 54.0514. SPECIAL SUMMER TUITION RATES. The governing

 board of an institution of higher education may charge an

 undergraduate student enrolled for a summer term or session at the

 institution an amount of tuition that is less than the amount of

 tuition otherwise charged under Section 54.0513, but not less than
- SECTION 2. Section 54.072, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

one-half of that amount.

- Sec. 54.072. FLAT RATE TUITION [PILOT PROJECT]. (a) In this section, "flat rate tuition" means all academic program costs related to enrollment in an academic course or degree program that are charged to a student, including all charges designated as tuition, mandatory fees, and incidental fees. The term does not include voluntary fees.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
 the governing board of an institution of higher education [regents
 of The University of Texas System] may charge flat rate [establish a
 pilot project at The University of Texas at Austin involving not

- 1 more than two colleges or degree programs designated by the board of
- 2 regents under which the university charges the same amount of]
- 3 tuition and fees, in a different amount for each group, to each of
- 4 the following groups of [all undergraduate] students enrolled in a
- 5 college or degree program at the institution:

- 6 (1) all undergraduate resident students;
 - (2) all undergraduate nonresident students;
- 8 (3) all graduate resident students; and
- 9 <u>(4) all graduate nonresident students</u> [included in the 10 pilot project].
- 11 (c) The board [of regents] may not require a full-time 12 student who pays <u>flat rate</u> tuition <u>and fees</u> under <u>this section</u> [the 13 <u>pilot project</u>] to pay more tuition <u>and fees</u> than the average amount 14 of tuition <u>and fees</u> that a student [not included in the pilot 15 <u>project</u>] would pay for enrolling in the <u>institution</u> [university for 16 <u>14 semester credit hours</u>] for the same semester or term for:
- 17 <u>(1) 15 semester credit hours if the student is an</u> 18 undergraduate student; or
- 19 <u>(2) nine semester credit hours if the student is a</u>
 20 graduate student.
 - (d) An institution is permitted to establish a different flat-rate amount for each college or degree program [The board of regents shall evaluate the effect of flat rate tuition charged under the pilot project on the number of semester credit hours taken by students included in the project each semester. The board shall report the results of the evaluation to the legislature not later than December 31, 2002, and December 31, 2004].

- 1 (e) <u>Upon receiving approval from the governing board for</u>
 2 <u>flat rate tuition amounts as allowed under this section, the</u>
 3 <u>institution shall report each flat rate tuition amount to the Texas</u>
 4 <u>Higher Education Coordinating Board and provide the calculations</u>
 5 <u>used in determining those amounts</u> [This section expires September
 6 <u>1, 2005</u>].
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
