A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the Indigent Health Care Advisory Committee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 61, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 61.012 to read as follows:

Sec. 61.012. INDIGENT HEALTH CARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

(a) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall establish an advisory committee to advise the commission on rules and policies concerning indigent health care services.

(b) The advisory committee shall consist of 11 members, including four consumers or persons representing consumers and seven other representatives, appointed by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.

(c) The advisory committee shall:

(1) conduct a feasibility study and develop recommendations regarding the implementation of a pilot program for the regionalization of county indigent health care services and assistance and hospital district services and assistance;

(2) review and propose recommendations for legislation updating indigent health care and treatment under this chapter, including:

(A) the health care services provided under Subchapter B;

2 for and health care services provided by:

- 3 (i) a county under Subchapter B;
4 (ii) a public hospital under Subchapter C;
5 and
6 (iii) a hospital district under Subchapter
7 C;

8 (C) the allocation method used for distributing
9 state assistance funds; and

10 (D) county reporting requirements and
11 enforcement by the department; and

12 (3) identify other areas or subjects related to
13 indigent health care that the advisory committee could review or
14 study.

15 (d) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
16 size or composition of the advisory committee.

17 (e) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,
18 the Health and Human Services Commission shall submit a report
19 regarding the advisory committee's recommendations to the
20 governor, lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
21 representatives, and the legislature.

22 (f) This section expires September 1, 2007.

23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
