A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of an advisory committee on health
3	care information technology.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 104, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 104.0156 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 104.0156. HEALTH CARE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY
8	COMMITTEE. (a) The statewide health coordinating council shall
9	form an advisory committee on health care information technology.
10	The committee must include representatives of interested groups,
11	including the academic community, health plans, pharmacies, and
12	associations of physicians, hospitals, and nurses.
13	(b) The advisory committee shall develop a long-range plar
14	for health care information technology, including the use of
15	electronic medical records, computerized clinical support systems,
16	computerized physician order entry, regional data sharing
17	interchanges for health care information, and other methods of
18	incorporating information technology in pursuit of greater
19	cost-effectiveness and better patient outcomes in health care.
20	(c) The advisory committee shall elect a presiding officer.
21	(d) Members of the advisory committee serve without
22	compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for the member's
23	travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and
24	the General Appropriations Act.

- 1 (e) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 2 size, composition, or duration of the advisory committee.
- 3 (f) Meetings of the advisory committee under this section
- 4 are subject to Chapter 551, Government Code.
- 5 SECTION 2. Subsections (e) and (f), Section 104.022, Health
- 6 and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (e) The state health plan shall be developed and used in
- 8 accordance with applicable state and federal law. The plan must
- 9 identify:
- 10 (1) major statewide health concerns;
- 11 (2) the availability and use of current health
- 12 resources of the state, including resources associated with
- 13 information technology and state-supported institutions of higher
- 14 education; and
- 15 (3) future health service, information technology,
- 16 and facility needs of the state.
- 17 (f) The state health plan must:
- 18 (1) propose strategies for the correction of major
- 19 deficiencies in the service delivery system;
- 20 (2) <u>propo</u>se strategies for incorporating information
- 21 technology in the service delivery system;
- 22 <u>(3)</u> propose strategies for involving state-supported
- 23 institutions of higher education in providing health services and
- 24 for coordinating those efforts with health and human services
- 25 agencies in order to close gaps in services; and
- 26 (4) [(3)] provide direction for the state's
- 27 legislative and executive decision-making processes to implement

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- 1 the strategies proposed by the plan.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
