## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of an advisory committee on health
- 3 care information technology.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. HEALTH CARE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY
- 6 COMMITTEE. (a) Not later than January 1, 2006, the executive
- 7 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 8 appoint an advisory committee on health care information
- 9 technology. The committee must include representatives of
- 10 interested groups, including the academic community and
- 11 associations of physicians, hospitals, and nurses.
- 12 (b) The advisory committee shall develop a long-range plan
- 13 for health care information technology, including the use of
- 14 electronic medical records, computerized clinical support systems,
- 15 computerized physician order entry, regional data sharing
- 16 interchanges for health care information, and other methods of
- 17 incorporating information technology in pursuit of greater cost
- 18 effectiveness and better patient outcomes in health care.
- 19 (c) Members of the advisory committee serve without
- 20 compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for the member's
- 21 travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and
- 22 the General Appropriations Act.
- 23 (d) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 24 advisory committee.

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- 1 SECTION 2. RECOMMENDATIONS. The advisory committee on
- 2 health care information technology shall deliver its
- 3 recommendations to the legislature and the executive commissioner
- 4 of the Health and Human Services Commission not later than
- 5 September 1, 2006.
- 6 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires and the advisory
- 7 committee on health care information technology is abolished
- 8 September 1, 2006.
- 9 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 10 1, 2005.
