A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a universal benefits issuance and identification card
3	for health and human services programs.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.080 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.080. UNIVERSAL SERVICES CARD. (a) The commission
8	may develop and implement a universal services card or other method
9	to consolidate recipient identification and benefits issuance for
10	the commission and health and human services agencies if the
11	commission determines that the implementation would be feasible and
12	<pre>cost-effective.</pre>
13	(b) The universal services card or other method may:
14	(1) incorporate a biometric identifier to enable
15	personal identity verification at a point of service and reduce
16	<pre>fraud;</pre>
17	(2) enable immediate electronic verification of
18	recipient eligibility; and
19	(3) replace multiple forms, cards, or other methods
20	used for fraud reduction or provision of health and human services
21	benefits, including:
22	(A) electronic benefits transfer cards; and
23	(B) smart cards used in the Medicaid program.
24	SECTION 2. (a) Not later than January 1, 2006, the Health

- 1 and Human Services Commission shall assess the feasibility and
- 2 cost-effectiveness of using a universal services card or other
- 3 method for consolidating recipient identification and benefits
- 4 issuance for various health and human services programs, including:
- 5 (1) the financial assistance program under Chapter 31,
- 6 Human Resources Code;
- 7 (2) the medical assistance program under Chapter 32,
- 8 Human Resources Code;
- 9 (3) the nutritional assistance programs under Chapter
- 10 33, Human Resources Code; and
- 11 (4) the special supplemental nutrition program for
- women, infants, and children authorized by 42 U.S.C. Section 1786.
- 13 (b) In conducting the assessment, the commission may
- 14 consider information obtained from:
- 15 (1) the Medicaid fraud reduction pilot program
- 16 required by Section 531.1063, Government Code;
- 17 (2) the Texas Integrated Enrollment Services
- 18 eligibility determination system; and
- 19 (3) the state's electronic benefits transfer system.
- 20 (c) The commission may require any health and human services
- 21 agency and the Department of Information Resources to assist the
- 22 commission in performing its duties under this section.
- SECTION 3. Not later than July 1, 2006, the Health and Human
- 24 Services Commission shall report the findings of the assessment
- 25 required by Section 2 of this Act to the clerks of the standing
- 26 committees of the senate and house of representatives having
- 27 jurisdiction over health and human services issues.

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SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
