A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 1 | AN ACT |
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| 2 | relating to the Medicaid fraud reduction pilot program. |
| 3 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. Section 531.1063, Government Code, is amended by |
| 5 | amending Subsections (d) and (g) and adding Subsections (d-1), (h), |
| 6 | and (i) to read as follows: |
| 7 | (d) In implementing the program, the commission may $[\div$ |
| 8 | $[\frac{(1)}{(1)}]$ exempt recipients who are children or who are |
| 9 | elderly or disabled <u>.</u> [; and] |
| 10 | (d-1) If the commission requires recipients who are |
| 11 | children under 15 years of age to participate in the program, the |
| 12 | commission may validate the identity of those children only by: |
| 13 | (1) obtaining [(2) obtain] a fingerprint image from a |
| 14 | parent or caretaker of $\underline{\text{the}}$ [$\frac{\text{a recipient who is a}}{\text{child, regardless}}$] |
| 15 | of whether the parent or caretaker is a recipient; or |
| 16 | (2) using an alternate method that does not involve |
| 17 | obtaining the fingerprints of the child or the child's parent or |
| 18 | <u>caretaker</u> . |
| 19 | (g) The commission shall implement [may extend] the program |
| 20 | statewide as provided by Subsection (h) [to additional counties] if |
| 21 | the commission determines that statewide implementation |
| 22 | [expansion] would be cost-effective. |
| 23 | (h) The commission shall adopt a plan to implement the |

program statewide in phases and shall terminate the statewide

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- 1 implementation at any stage of the process if the commission
- 2 determines that statewide implementation would not be
- 3 cost-effective. The plan must include for each phase:
- 4 (1) a description of the policies and procedures to be
- 5 <u>tested concerning the handling of lost, forgotten, or stolen cards</u>
- 6 carrying a fingerprint image or situations in which a fingerprint
- 7 match cannot be confirmed;
- 8 (2) a determination of whether the commission will
- 9 require children or persons who are elderly or disabled to
- 10 participate in the phase and the reason or reasons for including
- children or persons who are elderly or disabled in the phase; and
- 12 (3) a description of the manner and location in which
- 13 the fingerprint images will be initially collected.
- 14 (i) In developing the plan required by Subsection (h), the
- 15 commission shall seek comments from recipients, providers, and
- other stakeholders in the state Medicaid program.
- 17 SECTION 2. (a) In this section, "Medicaid fraud reduction
- 18 pilot program" means the pilot program required by Section
- 19 531.1063, Government Code.
- 20 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission, before
- 21 implementing a phase of the Medicaid fraud reduction pilot program
- 22 that requires mandatory participation by Medicaid recipients or
- 23 health care providers, shall submit a report regarding the phase to
- 24 the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of
- 25 representatives, and presiding officer of each standing committee
- of the senate and house of representatives having jurisdiction over
- 27 the state Medicaid program. The report must include a description

- 1 of each component of the plan for that phase, as required by
- 2 Subsection (h), Section 531.1063, Government Code.
- 3 (c) In addition to the report required by Subsection (c),
- 4 Section 2.23, Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 5 Session, 2003, the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 6 report, not later than February 1, 2006, on the status and progress
- 7 of the Medicaid fraud reduction pilot program to the governor,
- 8 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 9 presiding officer of each standing committee of the senate and
- 10 house of representatives having jurisdiction over the state
- 11 Medicaid program.
- 12 (d) The report required by Subsection (c) of this section
- 13 must include:
- 14 (1) a continued evaluation of the benefits of the
- 15 program;
- 16 (2) an evaluation of the strengths and weaknesses of
- 17 the policies and procedures tested in each phase required by
- 18 Subsection (h), Section 531.1063, Government Code;
- 19 (3) information concerning the cost-effectiveness of
- 20 the program;
- 21 (4) if the program has been implemented statewide, any
- 22 significant problems encountered; and
- 23 (5) if the Health and Human Services Commission
- 24 requires participation by children or persons who are elderly or
- 25 disabled, the reason or reasons for including children or persons
- 26 who are elderly or disabled in the program.
- 27 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act

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- 1 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 2 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 3 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 4 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 5 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
