A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the electronic submission of certain health care 3 transactions.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 2, Article 21.52Z, Insurance Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2. ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF CLAIMS. 7 (a) Before September 1, 2007, the [The] issuer of a health benefit plan by 8 contract may require that a health care professional licensed or 9 registered under the Occupations Code or a health care facility 10 licensed under the Health and Safety Code submit a health care claim 11 12 or equivalent encounter information, a referral certification, or an authorization or eligibility transaction electronically. This 13 14 subsection expires September 1, 2007.

15 (b) On or after September 1, 2007, the issuer of a health 16 benefit plan by contract shall require that a health care 17 professional licensed or registered under the Occupations Code or a 18 health care facility licensed under the Health and Safety Code 19 submit a health care claim or equivalent encounter information, a 20 referral certification, or an authorization or eligibility 21 transaction electronically.

22 <u>(c) A [The]</u> health benefit plan issuer shall comply with the 23 standards for electronic transactions required by this section and 24 established by the commissioner by rule.

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(d) A [(b) The issuer of a] health benefit plan by contract 1 shall establish a default method to submit claims 2 in a nonelectronic format if [there is] a system failure or failures 3 4 exist or a catastrophic event substantially interferes with the 5 normal business operations of the physician, provider, or health 6 benefit plan or its agents. The health benefit plan issuer shall comply with the standards for nonelectronic transactions 7 8 established by the commissioner by rule.

9 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a health benefit plan that is delivered, issued for delivery, or 10 renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A health 11 benefit plan that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed 12 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 13 14 effect on the date that the health benefit plan was delivered, 15 issued for delivery, or renewed, and that law is continued in effect 16 for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
