A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the percentage of certain tuition set aside to fund 3 financial assistance for resident undergraduate and graduate 4 students at public institutions of higher education.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6 SECTION 1. Section 56.011(a), Education Code, is amended to
7 read as follows:

8 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher 9 education shall cause to be set aside not less than <u>40</u> [20] percent 10 of any amount of tuition charged to a resident undergraduate 11 student under Section 54.0513 in excess of \$46 per semester credit 12 hour. The funds set aside under this section by an institution 13 shall be used to provide financial assistance for resident 14 undergraduate students enrolled in the institution.

15 SECTION 2. Section 56.012(a), Education Code, is amended to 16 read as follows:

(a) The governing board of each institution of higher 17 18 education shall cause to be set aside not less than 20 [15] percent of any amount of tuition charged to a resident student enrolled in a 19 graduate or professional degree program under Section 54.0513 in 20 21 excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. The funds set aside under 22 this section by an institution shall be used to provide financial assistance for resident students enrolled in graduate 23 and 24 professional degree programs at the institution.

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1 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to the portion of tuition set aside under Sections 56.011 and 3 56.012, Education Code, beginning with the 2005 fall semester. The 4 portion of tuition set aside under those sections in an academic 5 period before the 2005 fall semester is covered by the applicable 6 law in effect before the effective date of this Act, and the former 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
