A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a bonus for certain new public school classroom

3 teachers.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. (a) This Act may be cited as the "Texas Teacher

6 Excellence Act of 2005."

7 (b) The link between student achievement and teacher

quality is well documented in educational studies and literature.

Teacher qualifications, such as academic degrees and excellence,

are highly predictive of student performance. This state should

continue to maintain high and rigorous standards for what

12 accomplished teachers should know and be able to do. Meanwhile,

school districts across the state are experiencing teacher

shortages in a number of areas, including mathematics, science,

15 bilingual education, early education, and special education.

16 Effective teachers who are capable of inspiring significantly

17 greater learning gains for students in areas with critical

18 shortages of teachers should be rewarded for those skills. Bonuses

19 for highly qualified teachers in critical shortage areas would

20 provide an incentive for beginning candidates to choose one of

21 those areas. The Texas Teacher Excellence Act of 2005 seeks to

attract the most qualified teachers to the regions of the state

23 experiencing the greatest need.

SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 21, Education Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 21.415 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 21.415. BONUS FOR CERTAIN NEW CLASSROOM TEACHERS. (a)
- 3 Subject to available funds, a person employed as a classroom
- 4 teacher for the first time is entitled to a bonus of \$5,000 if:
- 5 (1) the person graduated in the top 10 percent of the
- 6 person's graduating class at a public or private senior college or
- 7 university with a grade point average of at least 3.5 on a
- 8 four-point scale or an equivalent grade point average;
- 9 (2) the commissioner, in accordance with commissioner
- 10 rule, determines the district employing the person has a critical
- 11 shortage of teachers qualified to teach mathematics, science,
- 12 special education, bilingual education, early reading, or any other
- 13 area designated by commissioner rule as an area that has a critical
- 14 shortage of teachers; and
- 15 (3) before the bonus is paid, the person enters into a
- 16 <u>written contract with the district under which the person agrees</u>
- 17 to:
- 18 (A) teach in the district for at least three
- 19 consecutive school years in an area listed or designated under
- 20 Subdivision (2); or
- 21 (B) reimburse the total amount of the bonus.
- (b) A bonus under this section shall be paid using funds
- 23 appropriated for that purpose and distributed by the commissioner
- 24 to each school district to which Subsection (a)(2) applies. A
- 25 person is entitled to a bonus under this section only to the extent
- 26 sufficient state funds are appropriated for that purpose. If state
- 27 funds are appropriated but are insufficient to fully fund the

- 1 bonuses, the commissioner shall reduce the amount paid for the
- 2 bonuses to each district to which Subsection (a)(2) applies, and
- 3 the district shall reduce the amount of the bonus the district pays
- 4 to each person entitled to a bonus under this section
- 5 proportionately so that each person receives the same amount of
- 6 money.
- 7 (c) A decision of the commissioner concerning the amount of
- 8 money to which a school district is entitled under this section is
- 9 <u>final and may not be appealed. Each district shall, in the manner</u>
- 10 and at the time prescribed by the commissioner, provide to the
- 11 commissioner proof acceptable to the commissioner of the employment
- of a person entitled to a bonus under this section.
- 13 (d) The commissioner may audit the expenditure of money
- 14 appropriated for purposes of this section. A school district's use
- of the money appropriated for purposes of this section shall be
- verified as part of the district audit under Section 44.008.
- 17 (e) A bonus a teacher receives under this section is not
- 18 considered in determining whether the district is paying the
- 19 teacher the minimum monthly salary under Section 21.402.
- 20 (f) In addition to rules adopted under Subsection (a), the
- 21 commissioner may adopt any other rule necessary to administer this
- 22 section.
- SECTION 3. Section 822.201(b), Government Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (b) "Salary and wages" as used in Subsection (a) means:
- 26 (1) normal periodic payments of money for service the
- 27 right to which accrues on a regular basis in proportion to the

- 1 service performed;
- 2 (2) amounts by which the member's salary is reduced
- 3 under a salary reduction agreement authorized by Chapter 610;
- 4 (3) amounts that would otherwise qualify as salary and
- 5 wages under Subdivision (1) but are not received directly by the
- 6 member pursuant to a good faith, voluntary written salary reduction
- 7 agreement in order to finance payments to a deferred compensation
- 8 or tax sheltered annuity program specifically authorized by state
- 9 law or to finance benefit options under a cafeteria plan qualifying
- 10 under Section 125, [of the] Internal Revenue Code of 1986, if:
- 11 (A) the program or benefit options are made
- 12 available to all employees of the employer; and
- 13 (B) the benefit options in the cafeteria plan are
- 14 limited to one or more options that provide deferred compensation,
- 15 group health and disability insurance, group term life insurance,
- dependent care assistance programs, or group legal services plans;
- 17 (4) performance pay awarded to an employee by a school
- district as part of a total compensation plan approved by the board
- 19 of trustees of the district and meeting the requirements of
- 20 Subsection (e);
- 21 (5) the benefit replacement pay a person earns under
- 22 Subchapter H, Chapter 659, except as provided by Subsection (c);
- 23 (6) stipends paid to teachers in accordance with
- 24 Section 21.410, 21.411, or 21.412[, or 21.413], Education Code, or
- 25 Section 21.413, Education Code, as added by Chapter 430, Acts of the
- 26 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, and bonuses paid to
- teachers in accordance with Section 21.415, Education Code;

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- 1 (7) amounts by which the member's salary is reduced or
- 2 that are deducted from the member's salary as authorized by
- 3 Subchapter J, Chapter 659; and
- 4 (8) a merit salary increase made under Section 51.962,
- 5 Education Code.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
