A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a request for placement of a security freeze on a
- 3 consumer file maintained by a consumer reporting agency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 20.034, Business & Commerce Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) On written request sent by certified mail that includes
- 8 proper identification provided by a consumer [and a copy of a valid
- 9 police report, investigative report, or complaint made under
- 10 Section 32.51, Penal Code], a consumer reporting agency shall place
- 11 a security freeze on a consumer's consumer file not later than the
- 12 fifth business day after the date the agency receives the request.
- SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 20.04, Business &
- 14 Commerce Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) A consumer reporting agency may not charge a fee for:
- 16 (1) a request by a consumer for a copy of the
- 17 consumer's file:
- 18 (A) made not later than the 60th day after the
- 19 date on which adverse action is taken against the consumer; or
- 20 (B) made on the expiration of a 45-day security
- 21 alert;
- (2) notification of the deletion of information that
- 23 is found to be inaccurate or can no longer be verified sent to a
- 24 person designated by the consumer, as prescribed by Section 611 of

- 1 the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. Section 1681i), as
- 2 amended;
- 3 (3) a set of instructions for understanding the
- 4 information presented on the consumer report;
- 5 (4) a toll-free telephone number that consumers may
- 6 call to obtain additional assistance concerning the consumer report
- 7 or to request a security alert; [or]
- 8 (5) a request for a security alert made by a consumer;
- 9 <u>or</u>
- 10 (6) a request for a security freeze made by a consumer
- who has submitted to the consumer reporting agency a copy of a valid
- 12 police report, investigative report, or complaint involving the
- 13 alleged commission of an offense under Section 32.51, Penal Code.
- 14 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 15 to a request for placement of a security freeze on a consumer file
- 16 that is made on or after the effective date of this Act. A request
- 17 for placement of a security freeze on a consumer file that is made
- 18 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 19 effect on the date the request was made, and the former law is
- 20 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
