## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring warning labels for certain buckets.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 756.011, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 756.011. TYPES OF REFRIGERATORS AND CONTAINERS
7	COVERED. Except as provided by Section 756.014, this
8	subchapter applies only to a refrigerator, ice box, or other
9	airtight or semi-airtight container that has:
10	(1) a capacity of at least 1-1/2 cubic feet;
11	(2) an opening of at least 50 square inches; and
12	(3) a door or lid equipped with a latch or other
13	fastening device capable of securing the door or lid shut.
14	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 756, Health and Safety
15	Code, is amended by adding Section 756.014 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 756.014. LABELING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN BUCKETS
17	(a) A person may not sell, distribute, or manufacture or offer for
18	sale, distribution, or manufacture a bucket with a volume of at
19	least four but not more than six gallons unless the bucket is
20	labeled in accordance with this section.

- 21 (b) A label under this section must:
- (1) be removable only by the use of a tool or a
- 23 solvent;
- 24 (2) be placed on the side of the bucket near where the

1	handle inserts into the bucket; and
2	(3) conspicuously display, on a contrasting
3	background:
4	(A) the words, in both English and Spanish:
5	(i) "WARNING"; and
6	(ii) "Children can fall into bucket and
7	drownkeep children away from bucket with even a small amount of
8	<pre>liquid";</pre>
9	(B) the likeness of a child reaching into a
10	bucket superimposed with an encircled slash; and
11	(C) an exclamation point contrasted against and
12	enclosed by a triangle to the left of the word "WARNING."
13	(c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
14	Services Commission by rule may prescribe additional
15	specifications for the labeling of buckets under this section to
16	conform with the labeling standards developed by the American
17	Society for Testing and Materials, as long as the specifications
18	are equally protective of public health as the provisions of this
19	section.
20	(d) A violation of this section is subject to the
21	enforcement and penalty provisions of Subchapters C and D, Chapter
22	501, and a bucket labeled in violation of this section shall be
23	considered a misbranded hazardous substance or a hazardous
24	substance for the purposes of those subchapters.
25	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
