- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article 55.03, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Art. 55.03. EFFECT OF EXPUNCTION. When the order of
- 7 expunction is final:
- 8 (1) the release, <u>maintenance</u>, dissemination, or use of
- 9 the expunged records and files for any purpose [other than a purpose
- 10 described by Section 411.083(a) or (b)(1), (2), or (3), Government
- 11 Code, is prohibited;
- 12 (2) except as provided in Subdivision (3) [3] of this
- 13 article, the person arrested may deny the occurrence of the arrest
- and the existence of the expunction order; and
- 15 (3) the person arrested or any other person, when
- 16 questioned under oath in a criminal proceeding about an arrest for
- 17 which the records have been expunged, may state only that the matter
- in question has been expunged.
- 19 SECTION 2. The Department of Public Safety of the State of
- 20 Texas shall as soon as practicable take action as necessary to
- 21 ensure compliance with Subdivision (1), Article 55.03, Code of
- 22 Criminal Procedure, as amended by this Act, including the
- 23 destruction of information that has been maintained by the
- 24 department solely to enable the department to comply with

- 1 Subdivision (1), Article 55.03, Code of Criminal Procedure, as that
- 2 law existed immediately before the effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
