A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	authorizing	the	use	of	approved	nonsurgical	methods	to

- 3 sterilize dogs and cats.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subdivision (3), Section 828.001, Health and 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (3) "Sterilization" means the surgical removal of the
- 9 methods and technologies approved by the United States Food and

reproductive organs of a dog or cat or the use of nonsurgical

- Drug Administration or the United States Department of Agriculture
- 11 to permanently render the animal unable to reproduce.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 828, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 13 by adding Section 828.0035 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 828.0035. STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS.
- 15 The State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners shall:
- 16 (1) develop information sheets regarding surgical or
- 17 nonsurgical sterilization to be distributed by a releasing agency
- 18 to a new owner; and

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- 19 <u>(2) adopt rules requiring an animal that has been</u>
- 20 sterilized under this chapter to receive an identification marker
- 21 <u>in a manner authorized by the board.</u>
- SECTION 3. Subsection (c), Section 828.004, Health and
- 23 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (c) A releasing agency may extend the deadline for 30 days

- 1 on presentation of a written report from a licensed veterinarian
- 2 stating that the life or health of the adopted animal may be
- 3 jeopardized by sterilization [surgery]. There is no limit on the
- 4 number of extensions that may be granted under this subsection.
- 5 SECTION 4. Chapter 828, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 828.0045 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 828.0045. NONSURGICAL STERILIZATION. A licensed
- 8 veterinarian may use nonsurgical methods and technologies approved
- 9 by the United States Food and Drug Administration or the United
- 10 States Department of Agriculture for use by veterinarians to
- 11 humanely and permanently render a dog or cat unable to reproduce.
- 12 SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 828.005, Health and
- 13 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) Except as provided by Section 828.006 or 828.007, each
- new owner who signs a sterilization agreement under Section 828.002
- 16 shall deliver to the releasing agency from which the animal was
- 17 adopted a letter signed by the veterinarian who performed the
- 18 sterilization [surgery].
- 19 SECTION 6. Section 828.012, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 (a) Surgery or nonsurgical sterilization performed in
- 23 accordance with this chapter must be performed by a veterinarian or
- 24 a full-time student of an accredited college of veterinary medicine
- as provided by Chapter 801, Occupations Code.
- 26 (c) A person associated with a releasing agency may not
- 27 interfere with the independent professional judgment of a

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- 1 veterinarian employed by or under contract with the releasing
- 2 <u>agency.</u>
- 3 SECTION 7. The State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners
- 4 shall adopt rules as required by Section 828.0035, Health and
- 5 Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2006.
- 6 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
