5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 84, Government Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 84. [UNAUTHORIZED] ATTORNEY COMPENSATION
8	SECTION 2. Sections 84.001-84.004, Government Code, are
9	designated as Subchapter A, Chapter 84, Government Code, and a
10	subchapter heading is added to read as follows:
11	SUBCHAPTER A. UNAUTHORIZED ATTORNEY COMPENSATION IN CRIMINAL
12	MATTERS
13	SECTION 3. Chapter 84, Government Code, is amended by
14	adding Subchapter B to read as follows:
15	SUBCHAPTER B. DIVISION OF FEES
16	Sec. 84.051. DIVISION OF FEES BETWEEN ATTORNEYS NOT OF SAME
17	FIRM. An attorney may not divide a fee for legal services with
18	another attorney who is not a partner in or associate of the
19	attorney's law firm, unless:
20	(1) the client consents to employment of the other
21	attorney in writing after a full disclosure that the fees will be
22	divided;
23	(2) the division is in proportion to the services
24	performed by each attorney or, after providing written notice to

1	the client, each attorney assumes joint responsibility for the
2	representation; and
3	(3) the total fee of the attorneys does not exceed
4	reasonable compensation for all legal services the attorneys
5	provided to the client.
6	SECTION 4. Section 84.051, Government Code, as added by
7	this Act, applies only to a contract for attorney's fees that is
8	executed on or after the effective date of this Act. A contract for
9	fees that is executed before the effective date of this Act is
10	governed by the law applicable to the contract immediately before
11	the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect
12	for that purpose.
13	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
