- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 775.025, Health and

- 7 Sec. 775.025. EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY SUBJECT TO [AD
- 8 **VALOREM**] ASSESSMENTS.
- 9 SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 775.025, Health and
- 10 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 (c) After the hearing, if the board finds that the entity
- 12 responsible for administering and collecting the ad valorem or
- 13 <u>annual variable budget</u> based assessments in the territory to be
- 14 excluded provides or contracts for the provision of substantially
- 15 the same services as provided by the district, the board shall:
- 16 (1) order an election on the question of exclusion; or
- 17 (2) declare by resolution the territory excluded from
- 18 the district.
- 19 SECTION 3. Subdivision (1), Subsection (0), Section
- 20 775.025, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 (1) "Planned community" means a planned community of
- 22 15,000 or more acres of land originally established under the Urban

- 1 (A) located in a county adjacent to a county with
- 2 a population of 2,800,000 or more according to the most recent
- 3 federal census; and
- 4 (B) subject to restrictive covenants containing
- 5 ad valorem or annual variable budget based assessments on real
- 6 property for use in part to finance services of the same general
- 7 type provided by the district.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
