4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1403.002, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
7	(g) In determining the counties and the colonia access
8	roadway projects that are to receive financial assistance and the
9	amount of assistance given to a county or project, the commission
10	shall prioritize projects that are located in communities with the
11	greatest need.
12	SECTION 2. Section 1403.003, Government Code, is amended to
13	read as follows:
14	Sec. 1403.003. ADMINISTRATION BY TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF
15	TRANSPORTATION [SET-ASIDE FOR COLONIAS LOCATED IN RURAL BORDER
16	COUNTIES]. (a) In this section:
17	(1) "Border colonia" means a border colonia as defined
18	by commission rule under Section 1403.002.
19	(2) "Department [Rural border county]" means the Texas
20	Department of Transportation [a county that:
21	[(A) has a population of less than 55,000; and
22	[(B) is adjacent to an international border.

- 3 (b) The department shall use existing funds to manage
 4 colonia access roadway projects serving border colonias that
 5 receive financial assistance under Section 1403.002. The
 6 department shall provide consulting services to counties receiving
 7 financial assistance for colonia access roadway projects on:
- 8 (1) the planning, designing, and constructing of 9 roadways; or
- (2) any other function necessary to implement the projects [The authority shall set aside an amount equal to 10 percent of the proceeds from each sale of general obligation bonds and notes under this chapter to provide financial assistance for colonia access roadway projects designed to pave roads serving border colonias located in rural border counties].
 - with the Texas A&M University Center for Housing and Urban Development and the Texas A&M University College of Architecture to assist the department in providing consulting services under Subsection (b) [authority, as directed by the Texas Department of Transportation, shall provide a grant from the set-aside on a priority basis to a rural border county that proposes to pave for the first time a road serving a border colonia located in that county].
