## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to notice of factors used in admissions and scholarship 3 decisions at certain public institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 51.805(d), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (d) Not later than <u>the 180th day</u> [one year] before the date 8 that applications for admission are first considered under this 9 section, each general academic teaching institution shall publish 10 in the institution's catalog a description of the factors 11 considered by the institution in making admission decisions and 12 shall make the information available to the public.

SECTION 2. Section 51.842(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

Not later than the 180th day [one year] before the date 15 (d) that applications for admissions and competitive scholarships are 16 first considered for a graduate or professional program under this 17 18 subchapter, each general academic teaching institution or medical and dental unit shall publish in the catalog of the institution or 19 unit a description of the factors to be considered by the 20 21 institution or unit in making those admissions and competitive scholarship decisions and shall make the information available to 22 23 the public.

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies

beginning with admissions and competitive scholarships for the 2005-2006 academic year. Admissions and competitive scholarships for an academic period preceding that academic year are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the prior law is continued in effect for that purpose.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
