## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the disqualification of certain persons for
- 3 unemployment benefits.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 207, Labor Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 207.054 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 207.054. JUDICIAL BRIEFING ATTORNEYS. Benefits are
- 8 not payable to an individual based on services performed as a
- 9 briefing attorney for a court in this state if the individual:
- 10 (1) performed the services for not more than one year;
- 11 and
- 12 (2) had notice at the time the services began that the
- 13 <u>individual's service as a briefing attorney would not exceed one</u>
- 14 year.
- 15 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act by the
- 16 enactment of Section 207.054, Labor Code, applies only to
- 17 eligibility for unemployment compensation benefits based on an
- 18 unemployment compensation claim that is filed with the Texas
- 19 Workforce Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 20 claim filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 21 law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and the former law is
- 22 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
