4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter M to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER M. DATA COLLECTION AND REPORTING RELATING TO EMPLOYERS
8	OF BENEFICIARIES OF CERTAIN HEALTH CARE SERVICES
9	Sec. 531.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Charitable care or services" means all care or
11	services provided for free or at discounted amounts at or below
12	actual costs based on a person's ability to pay. The term does not
13	include care or services covered by the Medicare program or
14	provided through public health care assistance.
15	(2) "Hospital" means a general or special hospital
16	licensed under Chapter 241, Health and Safety Code.
17	(3) "Proposed beneficiary of public health care
18	assistance" means the person on whose behalf an application for
19	public health care assistance is filed, including the applicant or
20	a dependent child or other dependent of the applicant.
21	(4) "Proposed beneficiary of charitable care or
22	services" means the person on whose behalf charitable care or
23	services are requested, including the person making the request or
24	a dependent child or other dependent of the person making the

1 request. 2 (5) "Public health care assistance" means: 3 (A) medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human 4 Resources Code; 5 (B) health benefits coverage under Chapter 62 or 6 63, Health and Safety Code; 7 (C) health care assistance provided by a county 8 under Chapter 61, Health and Safety Code; or 9 (D) medical assistance or benefits provided by a public health care program not described in this subdivision that 10 is administered by the commission or a health and human services 11 12 agency. 13 Sec. 531.452. APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE; EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION. (a) 14 The executive 15 commissioner by rule shall require a person applying for public 16 health care assistance to identify the employer or employers of the 17 proposed beneficiary of the assistance. (b) If the proposed beneficiary of the public health care 18 assistance is not employed, the applicant shall identify the 19 employer or employers of a person who is legally liable for the 20 21 proposed beneficiary's support. Sec. 531.453. REQUEST FOR CHARITABLE HOSPITAL CARE OR 22 SERVICES; EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION. (a) Each hospital shall require 23 24 a person requesting charitable care or services from the hospital 25 to identify the employer or employers of the proposed beneficiary

- 9 commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this

- 13 On request of the executive commissioner, the Texas Workforce
- 14 Commission shall provide information to the executive commissioner

- 17 (1) "Beneficiary of public health care assistance"
- 18 means a person who is receiving public health care assistance or who

- 6 identified under this subchapter during the immediately preceding
- 7 <u>calendar year. The report must include:</u>
- 8 (1) the name and business address of each employer in
- 9 this state that employs 25 or more persons in a calendar year who
- 10 are beneficiaries of public health care assistance or charitable
- 11 <u>care or services provided by a hospital;</u>
- 12 (2) for each employer described by Subdivision (1):
- 13 (A) the total number of employees receiving
- 14 public health care assistance;
- 15 (B) the total number of employees' dependent
- 16 children or other dependents receiving public health care
- 17 assistance;
- 18 <u>(C)</u> the total number of employees receiving
- 19 charitable care or services at a hospital; and
- 20 (D) the total number of employees' dependent
- 21 children or other dependents receiving charitable care or services
- 22 at a hospital; and
- 23 (3) the commission's analysis of the fiscal impact on
- 24 this state of providing public health care assistance to the
- persons described by Subdivisions (2)(A) and (B).
- 26 (c) The report may not include the name of a beneficiary of
- 27 public health care assistance or charitable care or services

- 2 <u>confidential by law.</u>
- 3 (d) The commission shall make the report available to the
- 4 public on the commission's Internet website.
- 5 <u>(e) The commission shall provide a copy of the report in</u>
- 6 written form to any person requesting the report.
- 7 SECTION 2. The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 8 Human Services Commission shall adopt any rules necessary to
- 9 implement Subchapter M, Chapter 531, Government Code, as added by
- this Act, not later than January 1, 2006.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
