(2) experience as a real estate lending officer of a financial institution or as a real estate broker that includes the actual performance or technical review of real estate appraisals.

26	Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, apply only to an application filed
27	with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or

after March 1, 2006. An application for a license or certificate filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

5 SECTION 25. The change in law made by the amendment to 6 Section 1103.451, Occupations Code, applies to a complaint filed 7 under that section that is pending on the effective date or filed 8 with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or 9 after the effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 26. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
