1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of real estate appraisers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1103.003, Occupations Code, is amended
5	by adding Subdivisions (2-a), (6-a), and (6-b) to read as follows:
6	(2-a) "Appraisal Standards Board" means the Appraisal
7	Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation, or its successor.
8	(6-a) "Federally related transaction" means a real
9	estate-related transaction that:
10	(A) requires the services of an appraiser; and
11	(B) is engaged in, contracted for, or regulated
12	by a federal financial institution regulatory agency.
13	(6-b) "Federal financial institution regulatory
14	agency" means:
15	(A) the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve
16	System;
17	(B) the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation;
18	(C) the Office of the Comptroller of the
19	<pre>Currency;</pre>
20	(D) the Office of Thrift Supervision;
21	(E) the National Credit Union Administration; or
22	(F) the successors of any of those agencies.
23	SECTION 2. Section 1103.151, Occupations Code, is amended
24	to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1103.151. RULES RELATING TO CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES.
- 2 The board may adopt:
- 3 (1) rules for certifying or licensing an appraiser or
- 4 approving an appraiser trainee in this state that are in accordance
- 5 with this chapter and consistent with[, but not more stringent
- 6 than, applicable federal law;
- 7 (2) rules relating to the education and experience
- 8 required for certifying or licensing an appraiser or approving an
- 9 <u>appraiser trainee</u> that are consistent with[, but not more stringent
- 10 than, the guidelines recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications
- 11 <u>Board</u> [Appraisal Subcommittee];
- 12 (3) rules relating to the examination required by
- 13 Subchapter F; and
- 14 (4) rules relating to procedures for the timely
- 15 renewal of a certificate or license.
- SECTION 3. Section 1103.152, Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 1103.152. APPRAISER CERTIFICATE AND LICENSE
- 19 CATEGORIES. [(a) In this section, "Appraisal Standards Board"
- 20 means the Appraisal Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation, or
- 21 its successor.
- 22 $\left[\frac{b}{a}\right]$ The board may:
- 23 (1) establish certificate and license categories that
- 24 are consistent with the categories recognized by the Appraiser
- 25 Qualifications Board[, the Appraisal Standards Board, and the
- 26 Appraisal Subcommittee]; and
- 27 (2) prescribe qualifications for each category that

- 1 are consistent with [not more stringent than] the qualifications
- 2 established for that category by the Appraiser Qualifications
- 3 Board[, the Appraisal Standards Board, and the Appraisal
- 4 Subcommittee].
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 1103.153, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1103.153. RULES RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION. The
- 8 board may adopt rules relating to continuing education requirements
- 9 for a certified or licensed appraiser or an approved appraiser
- 10 trainee.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 1103.154, Occupations Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 1103.154. RULES RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. The
- 14 board may adopt:
- 15 (1) rules as necessary to conform to the minimum
- written standards of the Appraisal <u>Standards Board</u> [Subcommittee]
- 17 by incorporating the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal
- 18 Practice;
- 19 (2) rules requiring a certified or licensed appraiser
- 20 to comply with standards of competency, professional conduct, and
- 21 ethics [generally accepted by the Appraisal Subcommittee and]
- 22 prescribed by the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal
- 23 Practice, as adopted by the Appraisal Standards Board [Foundation];
- 24 and
- 25 (3) rules relating to the standards for the
- 26 development of an appraisal and the conveyance of an appraisal
- 27 report by a certified or licensed appraiser that are consistent

- 1 with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice.
- 2 SECTION 6. Section 1103.202, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1103.202. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATE.
- 5 To be eligible for a certificate under this chapter, an applicant
- 6 must:
- 7 (1) pass the examination required by Subchapter F;
- 8 (2) successfully complete the number and type of
- 9 classroom hours or other educational qualifications required by the
- 10 Appraiser Qualifications Board [guidelines of the Appraisal
- 11 Subcommittee];
- 12 (3) provide evidence satisfactory to the board that
- the applicant has at least the minimum number of hours of experience
- 14 in performing appraisals over the specified number of calendar
- 15 years as required by the Appraiser Qualifications Board [guidelines
- 16 of the Appraisal Subcommittee]; and
- 17 (4) satisfy the board as to the applicant's honesty,
- 18 trustworthiness, and integrity.
- 19 SECTION 7. Section 1103.203, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1103.203. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSE. To be
- 22 eligible for a license under this chapter, an applicant must:
- 23 (1) pass the examination required by Subchapter F;
- 24 (2) successfully complete the number and type of [at
- 25 least 75] classroom hours <u>or other educational qualifications</u>
- 26 required by the guidelines of the Appraiser Qualifications Board
- 27 [in subjects determined by the board to be related to real estate

- 1 appraisal, including at least 15 classroom hours covering the
- 2 Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice];
- 3 (3) provide evidence satisfactory to the board that
- 4 the applicant has <u>at least the minimum number of hours of experience</u>
- 5 in performing appraisals over the specified number of calendar
- 6 years as required by the guidelines of the Appraiser Qualifications
- 7 Board [the equivalent of 2,000 hours of experience in performing
- 8 appraisals]; and
- 9 (4) satisfy the board as to the applicant's honesty,
- 10 trustworthiness, and integrity.
- 11 SECTION 8. Subsection (c), Section 1103.204, Occupations
- 12 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (c) The board shall give an applicant for a certificate or
- 14 license credit toward fulfilling the requirements of Sections
- 15 1103.202(2) and 1103.203(2) for classroom hours taken in the course
- of becoming licensed as a real estate broker or salesperson or for
- 17 professional development or continuing education courses taken,
- 18 whether the classroom hours or courses are taken by a person as a
- 19 real estate broker or salesperson or as an employee of a financial
- 20 institution engaged in real estate-related financial transactions,
- 21 if the classroom hours or courses satisfy the requirements
- 22 established by the guidelines recognized by the Appraiser
- 23 Qualifications Board [Appraisal Subcommittee].
- SECTION 9. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 1103.205,
- Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (b) An applicant for a certificate or license must provide
- 27 an affidavit on a form prescribed by the board stating that the

- 1 applicant has the required number of hours of experience in
- 2 performing appraisals as [established by the guidelines]
- 3 recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications Board [Appraisal
- 4 Subcommittee].
- 5 (c) For the purpose of determining the qualifications of an
- 6 applicant for a certificate or license under this chapter,
- 7 acceptable appraisal experience includes:
- 8 (1) any one or any combination of the categories
- 9 recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications Board [guidelines of the
- 10 Appraisal Subcommittee]; and
- 11 (2) experience as a real estate lending officer of a
- 12 financial institution or as a real estate broker that includes the
- 13 actual performance or technical review of real estate appraisals.
- 14 SECTION 10. Subsections (a), (c), and (d), Section
- 15 1103.209, Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The board may issue a certificate or license under terms
- 17 adopted by the board to an applicant who is certified or licensed
- 18 under the laws of another state having certification or licensing
- 19 requirements that the board determines have not been disapproved by
- 20 the Appraiser Qualifications Board [Appraisal Subcommittee]. The
- 21 terms must comply with the minimum criteria for obtaining a
- 22 certificate or license recognized by the <u>Appraiser Qualifications</u>
- 23 Board [Appraisal Subcommittee].
- 24 (c) The application form submitted for a reciprocal
- 25 certificate or license under this section must be comparable to the
- 26 form required of a resident of this state applying for a similar
- 27 certificate or license [by the state in which the appraiser is

1 certified or licensed].

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- 2 (d) The fee charged to an appraiser from another state for a
 3 reciprocal certificate or license under this section must be
 4 comparable to the fee required of a resident of this state applying
 5 for a similar certificate or license [by the state in which the
 6 appraiser is certified or licensed]. A person who obtains a
 7 certificate or license by reciprocity under this section must pay
 8 the federal registry fee and any other fee the board imposes.
- 9 SECTION 11. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 1103.211, 10 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
 - (b) A person may renew a certificate or license by:
- 12 (1) paying the renewal fee; and
- 13 (2) providing evidence satisfactory to the board that
 14 the person has completed continuing education requirements that
 15 comply with the guidelines recognized by the <u>Appraiser</u>
 16 <u>Qualifications Board</u> [Appraisal Subcommittee] and that are imposed
 17 by rule under this chapter.
- (c) For purposes of Subsection (b)(2), the board shall 18 accept as continuing education any educational offering that 19 20 complies with the guidelines recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications Board [Appraisal Subcommittee] that a certified or 21 22 licensed appraiser was awarded by a national appraiser organization approved by the board as a provider of qualifying appraisal 23 24 education.
- 25 SECTION 12. Subsection (b), Section 1103.251, Occupations 26 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 27 (b) The examination must be:

- 1 (1) written; and
- 2 (2) approved by the [Appraisal Foundation; and
- 3 [(3) consistent with, but not more stringent than, the
- 4 Uniform State Certification/Licensing Examination guidelines
- 5 endorsed by the] Appraiser Qualifications Board.
- 6 SECTION 13. Section 1103.254, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1103.254. EXAMINATION APPLICATION. (a) An
- 9 application to take the examination must be on a form prescribed by
- 10 the board.
- 11 (b) An application is active for one year beginning on the
- 12 date the application is initially accepted. If an applicant does
- 13 not pass the examination before the first anniversary of the date of
- 14 application, the applicant must submit a new application and pay
- 15 the appropriate fees.
- SECTION 14. Section 1103.256, Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 1103.256. MINIMUM PASSING GRADE REQUIRED. To pass the
- 19 examination, an applicant for a certificate or license must achieve
- 20 the minimum score required [or approved] by the Appraiser
- 21 Qualifications Board[, whichever is lower].
- 22 SECTION 15. Subsection (c), Section 1103.257, Occupations
- 23 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (c) If requested in writing by a person who fails an
- 25 examination, the board shall provide to the person an analysis of
- 26 the person's performance on the examination. The request must be
- 27 accompanied by a [notarized] statement identifying the person and a

- 1 fee in an amount determined by the board. The board shall release
- 2 the analysis directly to the person requesting the analysis.
- 3 SECTION 16. Section 1103.258, Occupations Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1103.258. REEXAMINATION. (a) An applicant who fails
- 6 an examination may apply to retake the examination on payment of an
- 7 additional examination fee.
- 8 (b) An applicant who has not successfully completed the
- 9 <u>examination</u> before the first anniversary of the date the
- 10 application was initially accepted by the board must submit a new
- 11 application and pay the required application fee [The applicant
- 12 must apply to retake the examination not later than the first
- 13 anniversary of the date of the examination the applicant failed].
- 14 SECTION 17. Section 1103.303, Occupations Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1103.303. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION.
- 17 A person is eligible to register with the board if:
- 18 (1) the certification and licensing program under
- 19 which the person is certified or licensed by another state has not
- 20 been disapproved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board [Appraisal
- 21 Subcommittee]; and
- 22 (2) the person's appraisal business in this state does
- 23 not exceed <u>six months</u> [60 days].
- SECTION 18. Section 1103.353, Occupations Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1103.353. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPRAISER
- 27 TRAINEE. To be eligible for approval as an appraiser trainee, an

- 1 applicant must:
- 2 (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- 3 (2) be a citizen of the United States or a lawfully
- 4 admitted alien;
- 5 (3) have been a resident of this state for the 60 days
- 6 preceding the date the application is filed; [and]
- 7 (4) satisfy the board as to the applicant's honesty,
- 8 trustworthiness, and integrity; and
- 9 <u>(5) meet all other qualifications established by the</u>
- 10 board.
- SECTION 19. Subsections (a) and (b), Section 1103.354,
- 12 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) An appraiser trainee approved by the board may perform
- 14 an appraisal under the direction of a sponsor or authorized
- 15 supervisor of the trainee.
- 16 (b) The sponsor or authorized supervisor shall sign each
- 17 report prepared by the appraiser trainee performing an appraisal
- 18 under the direction of the sponsor or authorized supervisor. The
- 19 [If an appraiser trainee has more than one sponsor, one sponsor
- 20 shall sign the reports prepared by the appraiser trainee. A]
- 21 sponsor or authorized supervisor [who signs a report] is
- 22 responsible to the public and to the board for the appraiser
- 23 trainee's conduct.
- SECTION 20. Subchapter I, Chapter 1103, Occupations Code,
- is amended by adding Section 1103.405 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1103.405. PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS. A person who holds
- 27 a license, certificate, or approval issued under this chapter shall

- 1 comply with:
- 2 (1) the most current edition of the Uniform Standards
- 3 of Professional Appraisal Practice adopted by the Appraisal
- 4 Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation; or
- 5 (2) other standards provided by board rule that are at
- 6 <u>least as stringent as the Uniform Standards of Professional</u>
- 7 Appraisal Practice.
- 8 SECTION 21. Section 1103.451, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 (a) Any person, including a member of the board, may
- initiate the complaint process under this subchapter by filing with
- the board a written [an affidavit stating the] complaint on a form
- 14 prescribed by the board.
- (e) A complaint alleging a violation by a person licensed,
- 16 certified, or approved under this chapter may not be terminated
- solely on the basis that the person fails to renew the certificate,
- 18 license, or approval.
- 19 SECTION 22. Subsection (a), Section 1103.004, Occupations
- 20 Code, is repealed.
- 21 SECTION 23. The Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification
- 22 Board shall adopt rules under this Act not later than January 1,
- 23 2006.
- 24 SECTION 24. The changes in law made by this Act with regard
- 25 to the requirements for issuing a license or certificate under
- 26 Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, apply only to an application filed
- 27 with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or

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- 1 after March 1, 2006. An application for a license or certificate
- 2 filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date
- 3 the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 4 for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 25. The change in law made by the amendment to
- 6 Section 1103.451, Occupations Code, applies to a complaint filed
- 7 under that section that is pending on the effective date or filed
- 8 with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or
- 9 after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 26. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
