The changes in law made by this Act with regard to the requirements for issuing a license or certificate under Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, apply only to an application filed with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or after March 1, 2006. An application for a license or certificate filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 25. The change in law made by the amendment to Section 1103.451, Occupations Code, applies to a complaint filed under that section that is pending on the effective date or filed with the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 26. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
