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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of funeral homes, cemeteries, and 3 crematories. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 711.004, Health and Safety Code, 5 is 6 amended by adding Subsection (m) to read as follows: (m) If a removal of remains is made to correct an error by a 7 cemetery organization, the cemetery organization is responsible 8 for all costs involved in the removal and reinterment of the 9 10 remains. SECTION 2. Section 711.012(b), Health and Safety Code, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: (b) The Texas Funeral Service Commission may adopt rules, 13 14 establish procedures, and prescribe forms to enforce and administer Sections 711.003, 711.008, 711.010, 711.011, 711.021-711.035, 15 711.038, 711.0395, 711.041, 711.042, 711.061, and 711.062 relating 16 to cemeteries that are not perpetual care cemeteries. 17 SECTION 3. Section 711.038, Health and Safety Code, is 18 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 19 (f) A cemetery organization may not resell the exclusive 20 21 right of sepulture in a plot unless the exclusive right of sepulture 22 has been reacquired by the cemetery organization. A sanction or 23 other penalty may not be imposed on a cemetery organization that 24 violates this subsection unless:

4	(2) the cemetery organization does not correct the						
5	violation before the 91st day after the date on which the cemetery						
6	organization received the notice.						
7	SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 711, Health and Safety						
8	Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0395 to read as follows:						
9	Sec. 711.0395. MULTIPLE INTERMENTS IN SAME PLOT. A						
10	cemetery organization may not make more than one interment in a plot						
11	unless each owner of the plot consents to the interment.						
12	SECTION 5. Subchapter A, Chapter 716, Health and Safety						
13	Code, is amended by adding Section 716.0035 to read as follows:						
14	Sec. 716.0035. ACCEPTANCE OF REMAINS. A crematory						
15	establishment may accept deceased human remains for refrigeration						
16	before it receives authorization to cremate the remains under						
17	Subchapter B.						
18	SECTION 6. Section 716.051, Health and Safety Code, is						
19	amended to read as follows:						
20	Sec. 716.051. CREMATION AUTHORIZATION. <u>A</u> [Except as						
21	otherwise provided in this chapter, a] crematory establishment may						
22	not cremate deceased human remains until it receives:						
23	(1) a cremation authorization form signed by:						
24	(A) an authorizing agent; and						
25	(B) a funeral director of the funeral						
26	establishment that contracted to provide for the cremation; and						
27	(2) a death certificate or other death record that						

1 indicates the deceased human remains may be cremated.

2 SECTION 7. Sections 716.052(a) and (c), Health and Safety
3 Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) A cremation authorization form must:

5 (1) identify the deceased person and the time and date6 of death;

7 (2) include the name and address of the funeral 8 <u>establishment</u> [director or other person] that contracted to provide 9 for the cremation;

10 (3)identify the authorizing agent and the relationship between the authorizing agent and the deceased person; 11 12 (4)include a statement by the authorizing agent that: the authorizing agent has the right to 13 (A) 14 authorize the cremation of the deceased person and is not aware of 15 any person with a superior or equal priority right; or

(B) if another person has an equal priority right
to authorize cremation, the authorizing agent:

(i) has made all reasonable efforts but failed to contact that person and believes the person would not object to the cremation; and

(ii) agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the funeral establishment and the crematory establishment for any liability arising from performing the cremation without the person's authorization;

(5) authorize the crematory establishment to crematethe human remains;

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(6) declare that to their knowledge the human remains

do not contain a pacemaker or any other material or implant that may potentially be hazardous or cause damage to the cremation chamber or the person performing the cremation;

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4 (7) include the name of the funeral establishment or 5 other person authorized to receive the cremated remains from the 6 crematory establishment;

7 (8) detail the manner of permanent disposition of the8 cremated remains, if known;

9 (9) list any items of value delivered to the crematory 10 establishment along with the human remains and include instructions 11 on the handling of the items;

(10) specify whether the authorizing agent has arranged for a viewing of the deceased person or service with the deceased person present before cremation and the date and time of the viewing or service; and

16 (11) include the signature of the authorizing agent 17 attesting to the accuracy of all representations contained on the 18 cremation authorization form.

19 (c) A funeral director [or other representative] of a 20 funeral establishment that contracts to provide for the cremation 21 of deceased human remains must sign the cremation authorization 22 form.

23 SECTION 8. Section 716.102(a), Health and Safety Code, is 24 amended to read as follows:

(a) A crematory establishment shall furnish to a
representative of a funeral establishment who delivers deceased
human remains to the crematory establishment a receipt that

1 includes:

2 (1) the signature and printed name of the
3 representative who delivered the remains;

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(2) the date and time of the delivery;

5 (3) the type of cremation container in which the 6 remains were delivered;

7 (4) the name of the funeral establishment [or other
8 entity] that contracted to provide for the cremation;

9 (5) the name of the individual who received the human 10 remains on behalf of the crematory; and

(6) the name of the deceased person.

SECTION 9. Section 716.103, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 716.103. IDENTIFICATION RESPONSIBILITY OF CREMATORY. (a) A crematory establishment shall place on the exterior of a cremation container a label with the deceased person's name as provided by the authorizing agent unless the crematory establishment knows the name is incorrect.

19 (b) A crematory establishment shall place, with the 20 cremated remains, in the temporary container, urn, or other 21 permanent container, a permanent metal identification disc, 22 bracelet, or other item that can be used to identify the deceased 23 person.

24 SECTION 10. Section 716.156(b), Health and Safety Code, is 25 amended to read as follows:

(b) A crematory establishment shall furnish to a person who
 receives the cremated remains a receipt that includes:

Section 651.154(a), Occupations 14 Code, is 15 amended to read as follows: (a) The commission shall set the following fees in amounts 16 17 reasonable and necessary to administer this chapter: (1) the funeral director's and embalmer's application 18 fee, license fee, duplicate license fee, and reciprocal license 19 fee; and 20 21 (2) the cemetery, crematory, or funeral establishment license fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty. 22 SECTION 13. Section 651.156, Occupations Code, is amended 23 24 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: (d) A subpoena or subpoena duces tecum issued under this 25 26 section is not effective unless it is issued in compliance with: (1) state and federal law; and 27

2	SECTION 14. Section 651.165(d), Health and Safety Code, is

14	SECTION 15. Subchapter D, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
15	amended by adding Section 651.1655 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 651.1655. REINSTATEMENT OF SUSPENDED LICENSE. A
17	person whose license has been suspended may renew the license by
18	paying to the commission a renewal fee that is equal to two times
19	the normally required renewal fee.
20	SECTION 16. The heading to Section 651.267, Occupations
21	Code, is amended to read as follows:
22	Sec. 651.267. REISSUANCE OF <u>REVOKED</u> LICENSE.
23	SECTION 17. Sections 651.267(a) and (d), Occupations Code,

No. 385 be made before the third [first] anniversary of the date of the 1 2 [suspension or] revocation. 3 (d) A license that has been revoked [or suspended for a 4 period of five years or more] may be reinstated only after the 5 applicant: (1) retakes and passes the applicable examination; 6 7 (2) pays a fee that is equal to two times the normally 8 required renewal fee; and 9 (3) satisfies any other commission requirements, including any continuing education requirements under Section 10 11 651.266. SECTION 18. Section 651.304(e), Occupations Code, 12 is amended to read as follows: 13 The commission by rule shall prescribe reporting 14 (e) 15 requirements for provisional license holders. The commission shall furnish report forms to be used by a provisional license holder. 16 17 SECTION 19. Sections 651.351(d) and (f), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 18 A funeral establishment must: 19 (d) 20 meet the building, fire safety, and health (1) and health ordinances of this state and of the 21 standards municipality in which the establishment is located; 22 (2) be located at a fixed place that is not tax-exempt 23 24 property or a cemetery; 25 (3) include facilities in which funeral services may be conducted; 26 (4) have access to rolling stock consisting of at 27

1 least one motor hearse; 2 (5) include preparation containing room a the 3 facilities, equipment, and supplies required by commission rule to 4 ensure the provision of adequate embalming services; 5 (6) include other facilities as necessary to comply 6 with the sanitary codes of this state and of the municipality in 7 which the room is located; and 8 (7) include а display containing sufficient merchandise to permit reasonable selection, including at least five 9 adult caskets, two of which must be full-size and displayed in a 10 <u>casket showroom</u>. 11 The least expensive casket displayed under Subsection 12 (f) (d)(7) must be a full-size casket displayed in the same general 13 manner as the other full-size caskets are displayed. 14 The three 15 adult caskets that are not required to be full-size under Subsection (d)(7) may be displayed: 16 17 (1) in a partial panel display; or (2) by video or brochure, online, or in any other 18 19 manner. SECTION 20. Section 651.353(d), Occupations Code, 20 is amended to read as follows: 21 (d) This section does not apply to: 22 (1)a family, fraternal, or community cemetery that is 23 24 not larger than 10 acres; 25 (2) an unincorporated association of plot owners not 26 operated for profit; a church, a religious society or denomination, or 27 (3)

an entity solely administering the temporalities of a church or 1 2 religious society or denomination; [or] 3 (4) a public cemetery owned by this state, a county, or 4 a municipality; or 5 (5) a perpetual care cemetery. 6 SECTION 21. Sections 651.354(a), (c), and (d), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 7 8 (a) The commission shall mail written notice to a cemetery 9 or funeral establishment of the impending expiration of the establishment's license not later than the 30th day before the 10 expiration date of the license. The [Except as provided by 11 Subsection (d), the] notice must state that: 12 (1) to renew the license, the cemetery or funeral 13 14 establishment must pay the renewal fee not later than the license 15 expiration date [September 30]; and (2) the license is automatically renewed on receipt of 16 17 the renewal fee. (c) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the 18 cemetery or funeral establishment [may not renew the license and] 19 may not operate as a cemetery or funeral establishment until the 20 21 renewal fee and the late payment penalty are paid [establishment is issued a new license in the manner provided for issuing an original 22 license]. 23 24 (d) This section does not apply to [To renew a license for] a 25 perpetual care cemetery [, the cemetery must submit a renewal on a form prescribed by the commission. The license is renewed on 26

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27 receipt of the form by the commission].

1 SECTION 22. Subchapter H, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is 2 amended by adding Section 651.355 to read as follows: 3 Sec. 651.355. PERPETUAL CARE CEMETERY REGISTRATION. (a) 4 The Texas Department of Banking shall provide annually to the commission a list of perpetual care cemeteries, including the 5 6 address and other contact information for each cemetery. The 7 commission shall annually register each perpetual care cemetery on 8 that list. 9 (b) A perpetual care cemetery is not required to pay a registration fee or renewal fee under this chapter. 10 SECTION 23. Section 651.405, Occupations Code, is amended 11 to read as follows: 12 Sec. 651.405. GENERAL [RETAIL] PRICE LIST; 13 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT. (a) "General [Retail] price list" means a printed 14 15 or typewritten list of the retail price of items or services provided by a funeral establishment and must include the retail 16 17 price of: transferring a deceased person to the funeral (1)18 19 establishment; 20 embalming; (2) 21 using a funeral establishment facility for viewing (3) the deceased; 22 23 (4) using a funeral establishment facility for funeral 24 services; 25 (5) using a hearse; 26 (6) using a limousine; 27 caskets, which may be provided at a range of retail (7)

1 prices;

2 (8) outer enclosures, which may be provided at a range
3 <u>of retail prices</u>; and

4 (9) <u>the basic services of the funeral director and</u> 5 other [itemized services provided by the] funeral establishment 6 staff.

A general [retail] price list must contain the name, 7 (b) 8 address, and telephone number of the funeral establishment, the 9 effective date for the stated prices, and the following printed "The goods and services shown below are those we can 10 notice: provide to our customers. You may choose only the items you desire. 11 However, any funeral arrangements you select will include a charge 12 for our basic services and overhead. If legal or other requirements 13 14 mean you must buy any items you did not specifically ask for, we 15 will explain the reason in writing on the statement we provide describing the funeral goods and services you selected." 16

SECTION 24. Section 651.4055, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 651.4055. <u>GENERAL</u> [RETAIL] PRICE LIST; CEMETERY OR CREMATORY. (a) In this section, "<u>general</u> [retail] price list" means a printed or typewritten list of the retail price of items or services provided by a cemetery or crematory.

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(b) A general [retail] price list must contain:

(1) the name, address, and telephone number of thecemetery or crematory;

26 (2) the effective date for the stated prices;
27 (3) notice required by Subsection (c); and

S.B. No. 385 (4) any other items that the commission may by rule 2 require.

3 (c) The <u>general</u> [retail] price list must contain the 4 following printed notice: "The goods and services shown below are 5 those we can provide to our customers. You may choose only the 6 items you desire. If legal or other requirements mean you must buy 7 any items you did not specifically ask for, we will explain the 8 reason in writing on the statement we provide describing the goods 9 and services you selected."

SECTION 25. Sections 651.406(a) and (d), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) A purchase agreement must state:

13 (1) the name, address, and telephone number of the 14 funeral establishment;

15 (2) the amount paid or owed to another person by the 16 funeral establishment on behalf of the customer <u>for a cash advance</u> 17 <u>item</u> and each fee charged the customer for <u>a cash advance item</u> [the 18 cost of advancing funds or becoming indebted to another person on 19 <u>behalf of the customer</u>];

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(3) the printed notice required by Subsection (b);

(4) the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the commission; and

(5) a statement that complaints may be directed to thecommission.

(d) If the customer selects a package arrangement based on
unit pricing, the itemization requirement is satisfied by providing
a purchase agreement that <u>discloses the total amount of</u> [itemizes]

Sections 651.4065(a) and (d), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: A purchase agreement must state: (a) 5 (1) the name, address, and telephone number of the 6 cemetery or crematory; (2) behalf of the customer]; 11 the printed notice required by Subsection (b); 12 (3) the name, mailing address, and telephone number of (4) the commission; (5) a statement that complaints may be directed to the commission; and (6) any other items that the commission may by rule require. SECTION 28. Subchapter J, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 651.461 to read as follows:

14 <u>Sec. 651.461. DEFENSE TO VIOLATION. A person licensed</u>
15 <u>under this chapter does not violate this chapter by engaging in</u>
16 <u>conduct regarding funeral arrangements under the direction of a</u>
17 person who:

18 (1) represents to the license holder that the person 19 is authorized to make funeral arrangements for the deceased; and

20 (2) provides written directions to the license holder
21 in the manner provided by Section 711.002, Health and Safety Code.

22 SECTION 29. Section 651.507(a), Occupations Code, is 23 amended to read as follows:

(a) The commission or an administrative law judge employed
 by the State Office of Administrative Hearings shall review each
 disciplinary proceeding to determine whether the license holder has
 <u>previously violated</u> [committed] the same provision of this chapter

or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation on one or more previous occasions]. If it is determined that the license holder has previously violated [committed] the same provision of this chapter or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation], the commission or administrative law judge shall impose a disciplinary action that is more severe than that imposed on the previous occasion.

8 SECTION 30. Section 651.658(d), Occupations Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 (d) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the 11 crematory establishment may not operate a crematory until the 12 renewal fee and late payment penalty are paid [A person may not 13 renew a license that has been expired for more than 30 days. A 14 person holding a license that has been expired for more than 30 days 15 must apply for a new license as required by this subchapter to 16 conduct a crematory business].

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SECTION 31. The following are repealed:

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(1) Section 716.004(b), Health and Safety Code; and

19 (2) Sections 651.304(b) and (c), 651.651(3), and
20 651.656(d), Occupations Code.

SECTION 32. Section 711.004(m), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, applies only to costs incurred as a result of an error that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Costs incurred as a result of an error that occurred before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the error occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

1 SECTION 33. Sections 651.165(d), 651.354, and 651.658(d), 2 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a license 3 that expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A license 4 that expired before the effective date of this Act is governed by 5 the law in effect at the time the license expired, and the former 6 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

7 SECTION 34. Section 651.1655, Occupations Code, as added by 8 this Act, applies only to a license suspended on or after the 9 effective date of this Act. A license suspended before the 10 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the 11 time the license was suspended, and the former law is continued in 12 effect for that purpose.

13 SECTION 35. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended 14 by this Act, applies only to a license revoked on or after the 15 effective date of this Act. A license revoked before the effective 16 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the 17 license was revoked, and the former law is continued in effect for 18 that purpose.

19 SECTION 36. Not later than January 1, 2006, the Texas 20 Department of Banking shall provide the initial list of perpetual 21 care cemeteries to the Texas Funeral Service Commission as required 22 by Section 651.355, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 37. Sections 651.406 and 651.4065, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a purchase agreement entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A purchase agreement entered into before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the agreement was entered
