- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 77.039, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 77.039. LICENSE DESIGN. (a) A commercial shrimp boat
- 8 license issued under this subchapter must be a [metal or plastic]
- 9 sign or emblem at least 32 square inches in size $[\tau]$ and \underline{be}
- 10 constructed of a durable material [have a different color or design
- 11 for each license period].
- (b) The character $[\frac{1}{1} \frac{1}{1}]$ and design of each class of
- 13 commercial shrimp boat license issued under this subchapter must be
- 14 distinguishable.
- 15 SECTION 2. The heading to Subchapter F, Chapter 77, Parks
- and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 SUBCHAPTER F. BAY SHRIMP LICENSE MANAGEMENT
- SECTION 3. Chapter 77, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended
- 19 by adding Subchapter G to read as follows:
- 20 <u>SUBCHAPTER G. GULF SHRIMP LICENSE MORATORIUM</u>
- 21 Sec. 77.151. GULF SHRIMP LICENSE MORATORIUM PROGRAM. The
- department shall implement a gulf shrimp license moratorium program
- 23 to promote efficiency and economic stability in the gulf shrimping
- 24 industry.

- 1 Sec. 77.152. ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF COMMERCIAL GULF SHRIMP
- 2 BOAT LICENSES. (a) After August 31, 2005, the department may not
- 3 issue or renew a commercial gulf shrimp boat license unless the
- 4 person seeking to obtain or renew the license documents to the
- 5 satisfaction of the department that the vessel for which the
- 6 license is sought:
- 7 (1) is owned by the person;
- 8 (2) was licensed as a gulf shrimp boat on the day the
- 9 renewal was sought or at the end of the licensing period immediately
- 10 preceding the period for which the license is sought; and
- 11 (3) is intended to be licensed and used as a commercial
- 12 gulf shrimp boat.
- 13 (b) An applicant for a new or renewed commercial gulf shrimp
- 14 boat license for a vessel must submit to the department with the
- 15 license application:
- 16 (1) the United States Coast Guard certificate of
- documentation for the vessel, if the vessel is required by United
- 18 States Coast Guard rules to be documented; and
- 19 (2) the certificate of number for the vessel as
- 20 required by Chapter 31.
- Sec. 77.153. GULF SHRIMP LICENSE MORATORIUM REVIEW BOARD.
- 22 <u>(a) The holders of commercial gulf shrimp boat licenses shall</u>
- 23 elect a gulf shrimp license moratorium review board of nine
- 24 members.
- (b) A member of the review board must be a holder of a
- 26 commercial gulf shrimp boat license.
- (c) The nine members of the review board must be selected to

- 1 reflect the following geographical distribution according to the
- 2 county of residence specified on the member's commercial gulf
- 3 shrimp boat license:
- 4 (1) two members representing Orange, Jefferson,
- 5 Chambers, and Harris Counties;
- 6 (2) one member representing Galveston County;
- 7 (3) two members representing Brazoria and Matagorda
- 8 <u>Counties;</u>
- 9 (4) two members representing Calhoun, Aransas,
- 10 Nueces, San Patricio, and Refugio Counties; and
- 11 (5) two members representing Kleberg, Cameron, and
- 12 Willacy Counties.
- 13 (d) The review board shall advise the commission and
- 14 department and make recommendations concerning the administrative
- 15 aspects of the gulf shrimp license moratorium program, including
- 16 <u>hardship and appeal cases concerning eligibility.</u>
- 17 (e) The executive director shall adopt procedures for the
- 18 election and operation of the review board. The executive director
- 19 shall solicit and consider recommendations from the commercial gulf
- 20 shrimp boat license holders regarding the procedures and the
- 21 continued need for the board.
- 22 (f) The review board is not subject to Chapter 2110,
- 23 Government Code.
- Sec. 77.154. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION; RULES. (a) The
- 25 executive director shall establish administrative procedures to
- 26 carry out the requirements of this subchapter.
- 27 (b) The commission shall adopt any rules necessary for the

- 1 administration of the program established under this subchapter.
- 2 Sec. 77.155. REPORT OF PROGRAM STATUS. (a) Not later than
- 3 January 1, 2010, the department shall report to an advisory
- 4 committee appointed by the presiding officer of the commission to
- 5 address issues relating to gulf shrimp in this state.
- 6 (b) The report under Subsection (a) must include an overview
- of the administration and status of the program established under
- 8 this subchapter and information concerning the sociological and
- 9 economic effects of the program.
- 10 (c) This section expires June 1, 2010.
- 11 SECTION 4. (a) As soon as practicable, the Parks and
- 12 Wildlife Commission shall adopt rules necessary to administer the
- 13 gulf shrimp license moratorium program established under
- 14 Subchapter G, Chapter 77, Parks and Wildlife Code, as added by this
- 15 Act.
- 16 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 17 Act, the executive director of the Parks and Wildlife Commission
- shall adopt procedures for the election of the gulf shrimp license
- 19 moratorium review board under Section 77.153, Parks and Wildlife
- 20 Code, as added by this Act. As soon as practicable after the
- 21 adoption of election procedures, but not later than November 1,
- 22 2005, the election of the gulf shrimp license moratorium review
- 23 board must be held.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
