A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to reducing paperwork required of school districts and

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 7.060 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 7.060. REDUCING PAPERWORK. (a) The commissioner
- 8 shall annually review and, to the greatest extent practicable,
- 9 reduce written reports and other paperwork required of a school
- 10 <u>district by the agency.</u>
- 11 (b) The commissioner shall adopt a policy that limits
- 12 written reports and other paperwork that a principal or classroom
- 13 teacher may be required to complete.
- SECTION 2. Section 39.075(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) The commissioner shall authorize special accreditation
- investigations to be conducted:
- 18 (1) when excessive numbers of absences of students
- 19 eligible to be tested on state assessment instruments are
- 20 determined;
- 21 (2) when excessive numbers of allowable exemptions
- from the required state assessment are determined;
- 23 (3) in response to complaints submitted to the agency
- 24 with respect to alleged violations of civil rights or other

- 1 requirements imposed on the state by federal law or court order;
- 2 (4) in response to established compliance reviews of
- 3 the district's financial accounting practices and state and federal
- 4 program requirements;
- 5 (5) when extraordinary numbers of student placements
- 6 in alternative education programs, other than placements under
- 7 Sections 37.006 and 37.007, are determined;
- 8 (6) in response to an allegation involving a conflict
- 9 between members of the board of trustees or between the board and
- 10 the district administration if it appears that the conflict
- involves a violation of a role or duty of the board members or the
- 12 administration clearly defined by this code;
- 13 (7) when excessive numbers of students in special
- 14 education programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, are assessed
- 15 through assessment instruments developed or adopted under Section
- 16 39.023(b); [or]
- 17 (8) in response to repeated complaints submitted to
- 18 the agency concerning imposition of excessive paperwork
- 19 requirements on classroom teachers; or
- 20 (9) as the commissioner otherwise determines
- 21 necessary.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.075(a), Education Code, as amended by
- this Act, applies beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.
- 24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
