## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of health care services by a physician
3	assistant during an emergency or a disaster.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 204, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 204.2045 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 204.2045. SERVICES PERFORMED DURING DISASTER.
8	(a) The supervision and delegation requirements of this chapter
9	and Subtitle B do not apply to medical tasks performed by a
10	physician assistant during an emergency or a disaster under the
11	state emergency management plan adopted under Section 418.042,
12	Government Code, or a disaster declared by the governor or United
13	States government. This section does not apply to medical tasks
14	performed by a physician assistant for compensation or other
15	remuneration.
16	(b) A physician assistant performing medical tasks under
17	this section is entitled to the immunity from liability provided by
18	Section 74.151, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
19	(c) A physician assistant may perform tasks described by
20	this section:
21	(1) under the supervision of any physician who is also
22	performing volunteer work in the emergency or disaster; or
23	(2) without the supervision of a physician, if a
24	physician is not available to provide supervision.

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(d) A physician assistant employed by the United States 1 2 government or licensed in another state may perform medical tasks in this state in circumstances described by Subsection (a) without 3 holding a license in this state. 4 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8

Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
