4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 771, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. [STATE] EMERGENCY MEDICAL DISPATCH
8	RESOURCE <u>CENTERS</u> [ <del>CENTER</del> ]
9	Sec. 771.101. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "center"
10	means the area health education center at The University of Texas
11	Medical Branch at Galveston that meets the requirements of 42
12	U.S.C. Section 294a and has received federal funding as an area
13	health education center.
14	Sec. 771.102. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The
15	<u>center</u> [ <del>Texas Department of Health</del> ], with the assistance of the
16	advisory council appointed under Section 773.012, shall establish a
17	pilot program to test the efficacy of using emergency medical
18	dispatchers located in a regional emergency medical dispatch
19	resource center to provide life-saving and other emergency medical
20	instructions to persons who need guidance while awaiting the
21	arrival of emergency medical personnel. The purpose of a regional
22	emergency medical dispatch resource center is not to dispatch
23	personnel or equipment resources but to serve as a resource to
24	provide pre-arrival instructions that may be accessed by selected

public safety answering points that are not adequately staffed or
 funded to provide those services.

3 (b) The commission shall provide technical assistance to 4 the <u>center</u> [department] to facilitate the implementation of the 5 pilot project.

6 (c) The <u>center</u> [department], with the <u>assistance</u> 7 [cooperation] of the advisory council, shall:

8 (1) design criteria and protocols and provide
9 oversight as needed to conduct the pilot program;

10 (2) collect the necessary data to evaluate the outcome 11 of the pilot program; and

12

(3) report its findings to the legislature.

Sec. <u>771.103</u> [<del>771.102</del>]. PARTICIPATION IN PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The <u>center</u> [<del>Texas Department of Health</del>] shall determine which public safety answering points are interested in participating in the pilot program.

17 (b) [The department shall establish criteria for selecting 18 qualified public safety answering points to participate in the 19 pilot program.

[(c)] Participating public safety answering points must agree to participate in any required training and to provide regular reports required by the <u>center</u> [department] for the pilot program.

Sec. 771.104 [771.103]. SELECTION OF PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS 24 25 AND REGIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL DISPATCH RESOURCE CENTERS (a) The center [Texas Department of Health], with the 26 [CENTER]. assistance of the advisory council, may [shall] select [one] public 27

1 safety answering points to participate in the pilot program or [point] to serve as [the] regional emergency medical dispatch 3 resource centers [center]. A public safety answering point may 4 participate in the pilot program and serve as a regional emergency 5 medical dispatch resource center. A [The] public safety answering 6 point selected [as the resource center] for the pilot program or to 7 serve as a resource center must:

8 (1) have a fully functional quality assurance program 9 that measures each emergency medical dispatcher's compliance with 10 the medical protocol;

11 (2) have dispatch personnel who meet the requirements 12 for emergency medical dispatcher certification or the equivalent as 13 determined by the [Texas] Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u>;

14 (3) use emergency medical dispatch protocols approved
15 by a physician medical director knowledgeable in emergency medical
16 dispatch;

17 (4) have sufficient experience in providing18 pre-arrival instructions; and

19 (5) have sufficient resources to handle the additional20 workload and responsibilities of the pilot program.

In selecting an existing public safety answering point 21 (b) 22 to act as <u>a</u> [the] resource center, the <u>center</u> [department and the advisory council] shall consider a public safety answering point's 23 ability to keep records and produce reports to measure the 24 25 effectiveness of the pilot program. The center shall share information regarding a public safety answering point's abilities 26 27 with the advisory council.

Sec. 771.105 [771.104]. CRITERIA FOR EMERGENCY 1 MEDICAL DISPATCH INTERVENTION. The center, with the assistance of 2 [department and] the advisory council, shall define criteria that 3 establish the need for emergency medical dispatch intervention to 4 5 be used by participating public safety answering points to 6 determine which calls are to be transferred to the regional 7 emergency medical dispatch resource center for emergency medical dispatch intervention. 8

9 Sec. <u>771.106</u> [<del>771.105</del>]. FUNDING OF PILOT PROGRAM. (a)</del> 10 Money in the 9-1-1 services fee fund may be appropriated to <u>The</u> 11 <u>University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston on behalf of the</u> 12 <u>center</u> [the Texas Department of Health] to fund the pilot program.

(b) The <u>University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston on</u>
 <u>behalf of the center and the center are</u> [department is] also
 authorized to seek grant funding for the pilot program.

16 (c) A political subdivision that participates in the pilot 17 program may pay an appropriate share of the cost of the pilot 18 program.

The provisions in this subchapter that require the 19 (d) center [department] to establish, conduct, and evaluate the pilot 20 program are contingent on the <u>center</u> [department] receiving funding 21 in accordance with this section. If a sufficient number of 22 political subdivisions in a region that could be served by a pilot 23 program offer to pay the <u>center</u> [Texas Department of Health] an 24 25 amount that in the aggregate, together with any other funding received under this section, is sufficient to fund the pilot 26 program for the region, The University of Texas Medical Branch at 27

Galveston, on behalf of the center [the department]:

2 (1) shall enter into contracts with the offering
3 political subdivisions under which each will pay an appropriate
4 share of the cost; and

5 (2) when the amount under the signed contracts, 6 together with any other funding received under this section, is 7 sufficient to fund the pilot program for the region, shall 8 implement the pilot program for the region.

9 Sec. <u>771.107</u> [<del>771.106</del>]. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. The <u>center</u> 10 [department] shall <u>biennially</u> report its findings to <u>the governor</u>, 11 the presiding officer of each house of the legislature, <u>and the</u> 12 <u>advisory council</u> no later than January 1 <u>of each odd-numbered year</u> 13 through 2009[<del>, 2005</del>].

Sec. <u>771.108</u> [<del>771.107</del>]. LIABILITY. The operations of the regional emergency medical dispatch resource center are considered to be the provision of 9-1-1 services for purposes of Section 771.053. Employees of and volunteers at the center have the same protection from liability as a member of the governing body of a public agency under Section 771.053.

Sec. <u>771.109</u> [<del>771.1071</del>]. WORK GROUP. (a) The <u>center may</u> [<u>presiding officer of the advisory council shall</u>] appoint a <u>pilot</u> <u>program</u> work group to assist the <u>center</u> [<del>Texas Department of</del> Health] in developing, implementing, and evaluating the pilot program and preparing a report on the <u>center's</u> [<del>department's</del>] findings.

(b) A member of the work group receives no additional
 compensation for serving on the <u>pilot program</u> work group and may not

1 be reimbursed for travel or other expenses incurred while 2 conducting the business of the <u>pilot program</u> work group.

3 (c) The <u>pilot program</u> work group is not subject to Chapter
4 2110, Government Code.

5 Sec. <u>771.110</u> [<del>771.108</del>]. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires
6 September 1, <u>2009</u> [<del>2005</del>].

7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
