- one-half payment of tuition and fees in advance of the beginning of
- 2 the summer term and the remaining amount in one or two later
- 3 payments to be made in the percentages and by the dates determined
- 4 by the governing board, provided that the final payment must be made
- 5 before the beginning of the last week of the summer term.
- 6 (c) The governing board may assess and collect incidental
- 7 fees for students utilizing the payment alternative authorized by
- 8 [(2) under] Subsection (a)(2) and the alternatives authorized by
- 9 [(1) and (2) under] Subsection (b) [of this section] and for
- 10 students delinquent in payments. The fees must reasonably reflect
- 11 the cost to the institution of handling those payments.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 17 legislative session.
