4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 2155, Government Code, is

7	(a) The Veterans' Land Board is delegated all purchasing functions
8	relating to veterans homes and veterans cemeteries.
9	(b) The Veterans' Land Board shall acquire goods and
10	services under Subsection (a) by any procurement method that
11	provides the best value to the Veterans' Land Board. The Veterans'
12	Land Board shall consider the best value standards listed in
13	<u>Section 2155.074.</u>
14	(c) At the request of the Veterans' Land Board, the
15	commission shall procure goods and services described by Subsection
16	(a) for the Veterans' Land Board. The Veterans' Land Board may use
17	the services of the commission in procuring goods and services
18	described by Subsection (a).
19	SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 2166.003, Government
20	Code, is amended to read as follows:
21	(a) Unless otherwise provided, this chapter does not apply

23	(1) a project constructed by and for the Texas

(7) a repair and rehabilitation project involving the use of contract labor, if the project has been excluded from this chapter by commission rule and does not require the advance preparation of working plans or drawings;

(8) an action taken by the Texas [Natural Resource
 Conservation] Commission on Environmental Quality under Subchapter
 F or I, Chapter 361, Health and Safety Code; [or]

(9) a repair, rehabilitation, or construction project
on property owned by the Texas Department of Housing and Community
Affairs or the Texas State Affordable Housing Corporation; or

 27 SECTION 3. Subdivision (7), Subsection (a), Section

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(7) "Veteran" means a person who:

161.001, Natural Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:

3 (A)(i) served not less than 90 [continuous] days, 4 unless sooner discharged by reason of a service-connected disability, on active duty in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast 5 Guard, United States Public Health Service (as constituted under 42 6 7 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), or Marine Corps of the United States after September 16, 1940, and who on the date of filing an 8 9 application under the program has not been dishonorably discharged 10 from the branch of the service in which the person served;

(ii) has at least 20 years of active or reserve military service as computed when determining the person's eligibility to receive retired pay under applicable federal law;

enlisted 14 (iii) has or received an 15 appointment in the Texas National Guard, who has completed all 16 initial active duty training required as a condition of the enlistment or appointment, and who on the date of filing the 17 person's application has not been dishonorably discharged from the 18 Texas National Guard; or 19

20 (iv) served in the armed forces of the 21 Republic of Vietnam between February 28, 1961, and May 7, 1975, if 22 the board adopts a rule regarding these veterans under Subsection 23 (b);

(B) at the time of the person's enlistment,
induction, commissioning, appointment, or drafting was a bona fide
resident of this state or has resided in this state at least one
year immediately before the date of filing an application under

1 this chapter; and

2 (C) at the time of the person's application under this chapter is a bona fide resident of this state. 3 The term 4 includes the unmarried surviving spouse of a veteran who died or who is identified as missing in action if the deceased or missing 5 veteran meets the requirements of this section, with the exception 6 7 that the deceased or missing veteran need not have served 90 [continuous] days under Paragraph (A)(i) of this subdivision, and 8 9 if the deceased or missing veteran was a bona fide resident of this 10 state at the time of enlistment, induction, commissioning, 11 appointment, or drafting.

SECTION 4. The changes in law made by Sections 1 and 2 of 12 this Act apply only to a contract or project for which the Veterans' 13 Land Board first advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, 14 15 offers, or qualifications on or after the effective date of this 16 Act. A contract or project for which the Veterans' Land Board, or a state agency acting on behalf of the Veterans' Land Board, first 17 advertised or otherwise solicited bids, offers, or qualifications 18 before that date is governed by the law in effect when the first 19 advertisement or solicitation was given, and the former law is 20 continued in effect for that purpose. 21

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
