| 4 | SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 251.004, Occupations |
| 5 | Code, is amended to read as follows: |
| 6 | (a) A person does not practice dentistry as provided by |
| 7 | Section 251.003 if the person is: |
| 8 | (1) a faculty member of a reputable dental or dental |
| 9 | hygiene school in which the member performs services for the sole |
| 10 | benefit of the school; |
| 11 | (2) a student of a reputable dental school who |
| 12 | performs the student's operations without pay, except for actual |
| 13 | cost of materials, in the presence of and under the direct personal |
| 14 | supervision of a demonstrator or teacher who is a faculty member of |
| 15 | a reputable dental school; |
| 16 | (3) a person: |
| 17 | (A) who performs laboratory work only on inert |
| 18 | matter; and |
| 19 | (B) who does not solicit or obtain work by any |
| 20 | means from a person who is not a licensed dentist engaged in the |
| 21 | practice of dentistry and does not act as the agent or solicitor of, |
| 22 | and does not have any interest in, a dental office or practice or |
| 23 | the receipts of a dental office or practice; |
| 24 | (4) a physician licensed in this state who does not |
| | |

represent that the person is practicing dentistry, including a 1 2 physician who extracts teeth or applies pain relief in the regular 3 practice of the physician's profession; (5) a dental hygienist: 4 5 (A) who is authorized to practice dental hygiene 6 in this state; and 7 (B) who practices dental hygiene in strict conformity with the state law regulating the practice of dental 8 9 hygiene; a person who is a member of an established church 10 (6) 11 and practices healing by prayer only; an employee of a licensed dentist in this state who 12 (7) makes dental x-rays in the dental office under the supervision of 13 the dentist; 14 15 (8) a Dental Health Service Corporation chartered 16 under Section A(1), Article 2.01, Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act (Article 1396-2.01, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes); 17 18 (9) a dental intern or dental resident as defined and regulated by board rules; 19 (10) a student: 20 who is in a dental hygiene program accredited 21 (A) by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental 22 Association and operated at an accredited institution of higher 23 24 education; 25 (B) who practices dental hygiene without pay general supervision of a dentist and under 26 under the the supervision of a demonstrator or teacher who is a faculty member of 27

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1 the program: 2 (i) in a clinic operated for the sole 3 benefit of the program's institution of higher education; or 4 (ii) in a clinic operated by a government or nonprofit organization that serves underserved populations as 5 6 determined by board rule; and 7 (C) who practices in strict conformity with state law regulating the practice of dental hygiene; 8 9 (11) a dental assistant who performs duties permitted 10 under Chapter 265, in strict conformity with state law; (12) a dentist or dental hygienist licensed by another 11 state or a foreign country who performs a clinical procedure only as 12 a demonstration for professional and technical education purposes, 13 if the dentist or dental hygienist first obtains from the board a 14 15 temporary license for that purpose; (13) a dental hygienist who is a faculty member of a 16 17 dental or dental hygiene school while practicing dental hygiene: 18 (A) under the supervision of a dentist licensed in this state or of a teacher or demonstrator who is a dentist 19 faculty member of the school; and 20 (B) strict conformity 21 in with state law 22 regulating the practice of dental hygiene; (14) a dentist who is in a remedial training program 23 sponsored by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American 24 25 Dental Association at an accredited dental or dental hygiene school; 26 (15) a dental hygienist who is in a remedial training 27

program sponsored by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association at an accredited dental or dental hygiene school and who acts in strict conformity with state law regulating the practice of dental hygiene, except that supervision may be provided by a demonstrator or teacher who is a dentist member of the program;

7 (16) a dentist who is not licensed in this state and
8 who is taking the dental clinical examination offered [by the
9 Western Regional Examining Board] in this state <u>by an examining</u>
10 body designated by the board;

(17) a dental hygienist who is not licensed in this 11 state and who is taking the dental hygiene clinical examination 12 offered [by the Western Regional Examining Board] in this state by 13 an examining body designated by the board if participation is in 14 15 strict conformity with state law regulating the practice of dental hygiene, except that supervision may be provided by a dentist whose 16 services are secured by the examining body [Western Regional 17 18 Examining Board];

(18) a dentist whose license is in retired status or who is licensed in another state and is attending a continuing education clinical program offered at a dental or dental hygiene school accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association; or

(19) a dental hygienist whose dental hygienist license
is in retired status or who is licensed in another state and is
attending a continuing education clinical program offered at a
dental or dental hygiene school accredited by the Commission on

Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association if tasks are performed in strict conformity with state law regulating the practice of dental hygiene, except that supervision may be provided by a dentist member of the program.

5 SECTION 2. Subsection (d), Section 255.006, Occupations 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 (d) The board shall adopt rules concerning the 8 investigation of a complaint filed with the board. The rules 9 adopted under this subsection must:

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(1) distinguish between categories of complaints;

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11 (2) ensure that a complaint is not dismissed without 12 appropriate consideration;

(3) require that the board be advised of a complaint that is dismissed and that a letter be sent to the person who filed the complaint explaining the action taken on the dismissed complaint;

17 (4) ensure that the person who filed the complaint has18 an opportunity to explain the allegations made in the complaint;

19 (5) require that investigators used by the board be
20 state employees; and

(6) establish procedures by which a board employee may dismiss a complaint if the investigation does not reveal a violation[; and

24 [(7) establish procedures by which a board employee
25 may expunge from the records of the board a complaint dismissed
26 under Subdivision (6) if the employee determines the complaint to
27 have been groundless].

1 SECTION 3. Section 256.102, Occupations Code, is amended by 2 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (f) to read as 3 follows:

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(c) A license holder on retired status:

5 (1) is not required to pay license renewal fees; and
6 (2) except as provided by Subsection (f), may not
7 perform any activity regulated under this subtitle.

8 (f) A dentist on retired status may perform an activity 9 regulated under this subtitle if the dentist's practice consists 10 only of voluntary charity care, as defined by board rule. The 11 board's rules under this subsection must prescribe the scope of 12 practice permitted for the retired dentist, the retired dentist's 13 authority to prescribe and administer drugs, and any continuing 14 education requirements applicable to the retired dentist.

SECTION 4. Section 256.103, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

17 (c) A person may practice without displaying the person's 18 current registration certificate as required by Subsection (a) for 19 not more than 30 days after the date the person receives from the 20 board written confirmation that the person's original license was 21 issued.

22 SECTION 5. Section 258.054, Occupations Code, is amended by 23 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

24 (c) A dentist may not authorize a dental assistant to make a
25 dental x-ray unless the dental assistant holds an x-ray certificate
26 issued under Section 265.005.

27 SECTION 6. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 263.004,

1 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

2 (b) The board may <u>not</u> temporarily suspend a license or 3 permit under this section without notice or hearing <u>unless</u> [if] at 4 the time of the temporary suspension the board or the executive 5 committee requests the State Office of Administrative Hearings to 6 set a date for a hearing on the temporary suspension.

7 (c) The State Office of Administrative Hearings shall hold a 8 hearing not later than the <u>30th</u> [14th] day after the date the 9 license or permit is suspended unless the license or permit holder 10 requests a continuance. The State Office of Administrative 11 Hearings shall hold a second hearing on the suspension and on any 12 other action to be taken against the license or permit holder not 13 later than the 60th day after:

14 (1) the date the license or permit is temporarily 15 suspended; or

16 (2) the date specified in the continuance requested by17 the license or permit holder.

SECTION 7. Subsections (a) and (b), Section 263.006, Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The board shall suspend a license holder's license
 issued under this subtitle <u>on proof</u> [if it is determined at an
 administrative hearing] that the person has been:

23 (1) initially convicted of: 24 (A) a felony; 25 (B) a misdemeanor under Chapter 22, Penal Code, 26 other than a misdemeanor punishable by fine only; 27 (C) a misdemeanor on conviction of which a

| 18 | SECTION 8. Subsection (b), Section 265.004, Occupations |
| 19 | Code, is amended to read as follows: |
| 20 | (b) To qualify for a certificate, an applicant must: |
| 21 | (1) have at least two years' experience as a dental |
| 22 | assistant; and |
| 23 | (2) have successfully completed a minimum of 16 hours |
| 24 | of clinical and didactic education in pit and fissure sealants |
| 25 | taken through an accredited dental hygiene program or a dental |
| 26 | assisting program accredited by the Commission on Dental |
| 27 | Accreditation of the American Dental Association and approved by |

1 the board.

2 SECTION 9. Section 265.005, Occupations Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

Sec. 265.005. X-RAY CERTIFICATE. (a) 4 A dental assistant may not make dental x-rays unless the dental assistant holds a 5 6 certificate of registration issued by the board under this section.

7 (b) To qualify for a certificate of registration, a dental assistant must pay a fee in an amount determined by the board and: 8

pass an examination administered under this 9 (1) section on completion of a course [by the board] covering: 10 the procedure for making dental x-rays;

infection control; or

(2) complete a course and pass an examination 14 [administered by the board] covering the subject described by 15 16 Subdivision (1)(B) and be certified as a dental assistant by the 17 Dental Assisting National Board if the board determines that the 18 requirements for certification by that board are sufficient to protect the public. 19

[The board shall set the registration fee for a dental 20 (c) assistant who qualifies under Subsection (b)(1) in an amount 21 22 greater than the amount of the registration fee for a dental assistant who qualifies under Subsection (b)(2). 23

[(d)] The course and [portion of the] examination described 24 25 by Subsection (b)(1) [(b)(1)(B)] must be tailored to a dental assistant's responsibilities and role in a dental office. 26

(d) A course and examination described by Subsection (b) may 27

| 1 | be offered through self-study, interactive computer courses, or |
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| 2 | lecture courses and may be offered through the Internet. The course |
| 3 | and examination must comply with rules adopted under Subsection (f) |
| 4 | and be approved by the board. |
| 5 | (e) [The board shall develop the examination or contract |
| 6 | with another person the board determines has the expertise and |
| 7 | resources to develop the examination.] The board shall [may] |
| 8 | create an advisory committee consisting of dentists, dental |
| 9 | assistants, and dental assistant [industry professionals and] |
| 10 | educators to advise the board in adopting rules under Subsection |
| 11 | <u>(f).</u> |
| 12 | (f) The board by rule shall set: |
| 13 | (1) objectives for [developing] the examination and |
| 14 | course under Subsection (b)(1); and |
| 15 | (2) procedures to ensure the examination's integrity. |
| 16 | (g) [(f)] The <u>course and</u> examination <u>under Subsection</u> |
| 17 | (b)(1) shall comply with board rules. Any school or program |
| 18 | accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the |
| 19 | American Dental Association or any dental industry professional |
| 20 | organization may offer a course and examination that complies with |
| 21 | board rules. |
| 22 | (h) The board, in consultation with the advisory committee, |
| 23 | shall develop a program to ensure that courses and examinations |
| 24 | developed or administered under this section comply with board |
| 25 | rules [be administered by the board or by a testing service under an |
| 26 | agreement with the board]. |
| 27 | <u>(i)</u> [(g)] A certificate of registration issued under this |

section must be renewed annually. Except as otherwise provided by 1 this subsection, the board may not require a person who has 2 3 successfully completed the course and examination required under Subsection (b) to complete an additional course or examination to 4 renew the registration. The board may require a person to complete 5 a new course and examination if the person fails to renew the 6 7 person's certificate of registration before the second anniversary of the date the certificate expired. 8

9 <u>(j)</u> [(h)] The board by rule shall develop a mandatory 10 continuing education program for holders of certificates of 11 registration. The board may not require a person to complete more 12 than 12 hours of continuing education annually. The curriculum 13 must cover <u>dental assistant duties</u> [standards of care, procedures 14 <u>for infectious disease control</u>, and the requirements of this 15 <u>subtitle</u>].

16 <u>(k)</u> A person may not renew a certificate of registration 17 unless the person complies with the continuing education 18 requirements. <u>The person may fulfill continuing education</u> 19 <u>requirements through board-approved self-study</u>, interactive 20 <u>computer courses</u>, or lecture courses.

21 (1) A dental assistant who is hired as a dental assistant 22 for the first time and who has not previously been issued a 23 certificate under this section may make dental x-rays without 24 complying with this section until the first anniversary of the date 25 on which the dental assistant is hired.

26 SECTION 10. Subsection (d-2), Section 255.006, Occupations 27 Code, is repealed.

1 SECTION 11. (a) Section 256.103, Occupations Code, as 2 amended by this Act, applies only to a person licensed on or after 3 the effective date of this Act. A person licensed before that date 4 is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective 5 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that 6 purpose.

7 (b) Section 263.006, Occupations Code, as amended by this 8 Act, applies only to a person who is initially convicted of an 9 offense on or after the effective date of this Act. A person 10 initially convicted of an offense before that date is governed by 11 the law in effect on the date the conviction occurred, and the 12 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

(c) Section 263.004, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a license or permit suspended on or after the effective date of this Act. A license or permit suspended before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the license or permit was suspended, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 12. Not later than March 1, 2006, the State Board of
 Dental Examiners shall adopt the rules required by Subsection (f),
 Section 256.102, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

22 SECTION 13. Not later than July 1, 2006, the State Board of 23 Dental Examiners shall adopt the rules required by Subsection (f), 24 Section 265.005, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

25 SECTION 14. Compliance with Section 265.005, Occupations 26 Code, as amended by this Act, is required only for a certificate of 27 registration issued or renewed on or after September 1, 2006,

except as provided by this section and Section 15 of this Act. If the State Board of Dental Examiners determines that additional time is necessary to implement the new course and examination system under Section 265.005, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, the board may extend the time required for compliance under this section to January 1, 2007.

7 SECTION 15. (a) This section applies only to a dental 8 assistant who qualified for registration with the State Board of 9 Dental Examiners under former 22 T.A.C. Section 115.10 before 10 September 1, 2004, by successfully completing the examination 11 described by Subdivision (3), Subsection (e) of that section.

(b) Section 258.054, Occupations Code, as amended by this
Act, does not apply to a dental assistant until on and after
September 1, 2007.

(c) A dental assistant is not required to obtain a
certificate of registration under Section 265.005, Occupations
Code, as amended by this Act, before September 1, 2007. Before
September 1, 2007, a dental assistant shall comply with:

(1) the former law, and the former law is continued ineffect for that purpose; or

(2) Section 265.005, Occupations Code, as amended bythis Act.

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SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
