## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	
2	relating to the enforcement of certain standards for commercial	
3	motor vehicles.	
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:	
5	SECTION 1. Section 621.001, Transportation Code, is amended	
6	by adding Subdivision (12) to read as follows:	
7	(12) "Port of entry" means a place designated by	
8	executive order of the president of the United States, by order of	
9	the United States secretary of the treasury, or by act of the United	
10	States Congress at which a customs officer is authorized to accept	
11	entries of merchandise, collect duties, and enforce customs and	
12	navigation laws. The term includes a publicly owned or privately	
13	owned international port of entry between this state and the United	
14	Mexican States.	
15	SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 621.101, Transportation	
16	Code, is amended to read as follows:	
17	(c) This section does not:	
18	(1) authorize size or weight limits on the national	
19	system of interstate and defense highways in this state greater	
20	than those permitted under 23 U.S.C. Section 127, as amended; [or]	
21	(2) prohibit the operation of a vehicle or combination	
22	of vehicles that could be lawfully operated on a highway or road of	
23	this state on December 16, 1974 <u>; or</u>	

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(3) apply to a vehicle or combination of vehicles that

1	operates	exclusively:
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- 2 (A) at a private port of entry;
- 3 (B) on private roads associated with the port of
- 4 entry; and
- 5 (C) across a public highway between private roads
- 6 associated with the port of entry under a contract under Section
- 7 623.052.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 621.408, Transportation
- 9 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) If a noncommissioned employee weighs a vehicle under
- 11 Section 621.402 and determines that an enforcement action, such as
- 12 the issuance of a citation, is warranted, the employee may take
- 13 enforcement action only if the employee is under the supervision of
- 14 <u>an officer of the Department of Public Safety</u> [only a supervising
- 15 officer may take the action].
- SECTION 4. Section 644.001, Transportation Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Subdivision (7) to read as follows:
- 18 (7) "Port of entry" has the meaning assigned by
- 19 <u>Section 621.0</u>01.
- SECTION 5. Subsection (d), Section 644.103, Transportation
- 21 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (d) A noncommissioned employee of the department who is
- 23 certified for the purpose by the director and who is supervised by
- 24 an officer of the department may, at a fixed-site facility, stop,
- enter, or detain a motor vehicle that is subject to this chapter.
- 26 If the employee's inspection shows that an enforcement action, such
- 27 as the issuance of a citation, is warranted for a violation of this

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- 1 title or a rule adopted under this title, including a federal safety
- 2 <u>regulation adopted under this chapter</u>, the noncommissioned
- 3 employee may take enforcement action only if the employee is under
- 4 the supervision of an officer of the department.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
