A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the enforcement of certain standards for commercial 3 motor vehicles. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 621.001, Transportation Code, is amended 6 by adding Subdivision (12) to read as follows: (12) "Port of entry" means a place designated by 7 executive order of the president of the United States, by order of 8 9 the United States secretary of the treasury, or by act of the United States Congress at which a customs officer is authorized to accept 10 entries of merchandise, collect duties, and enforce customs and 11 12 navigation laws. The term includes a publicly owned or privately owned international port of entry between this state and the United 13 14 Mexican States. SECTION 2. Section 621.408(b), Transportation Code, 15 is amended to read as follows: 16 (b) If a noncommissioned employee weighs a vehicle under 17 18 Section 621.402 and determines that an enforcement action, such as the issuance of a citation, is warranted, the employee may take 19 enforcement action only if the employee is under the supervision of 20 21 an officer of the Department of Public Safety [only a supervising 22 officer may take the action]. SECTION 3. Section 644.001, Transportation Code, is amended 23 24 by adding Subdivision (7) to read as follows:

5 (d) A noncommissioned employee of the department who is 6 certified for the purpose by the director and who is supervised by an officer of the department may, at a fixed-site facility, stop, 7 enter, or detain a motor vehicle that is subject to this chapter. 8 If the employee's inspection shows that an enforcement action, such 9 as the issuance of a citation, is warranted for a violation of this 10 11 title or a rule adopted under this title, including a federal safety regulation adopted under this chapter, the noncommissioned 12 employee may take enforcement action only if the employee is under 13 the supervision of an officer of the department. 14

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
