14	(3) contains the following statement in bold,
15	underlined, capitalized, 16-point type:
16	"BY ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT YOU ARE WAIVING YOUR RIGHT
17	TO DEMAND A JURY TRIAL. THE LAW DOES NOT REQUIRE THAT YOU WAIVE THIS
18	RIGHT."
19	(b) A party who asserts that an individual consumer has
20	waived the right to demand a jury trial in a written agreement
21	relating to a consumer transaction has the burden of proof to show
22	that the waiver is enforceable under Subsection (a).
23	(c) On motion of a party in a proceeding relating to a
24	consumer transaction, the court shall conduct a hearing to

- 3 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a written agreement
- 4 entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A written
- 5 agreement entered into before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
