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relating to identifying which public institutions of higher

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5

6 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide guidance

regarding the definition of a comprehensive research university of 7

the first class to enable a common understanding and the use of

common terminology in legislative decisions relating to the

designation of and support for universities of that character.

SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is 11

amended by adding Section 61.0818 to read as follows:

13 Sec. 61.0818. IDENTIFYING INSTITUTIONS AS COMPREHENSIVE

RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES OF THE FIRST CLASS. (a) The board shall 14

establish a system for designating a general academic teaching 15

institution as a comprehensive research university of the first

class and shall prescribe criteria to determine whether a general

18 academic teaching institution should be assigned that designation.

The board shall determine which general academic teaching 19

institutions merit the designation and shall periodically review 20

21 that determination.

22 (b) In prescribing the criteria for purposes of Subsection

23 (a), the board shall consider the criteria used by generally

24 recognized college and university classification systems to

- 1 identify those universities in the highest classification or
- 2 ranking. The board shall specifically consider whether to
- 3 prescribe criteria based on the following factors:
- 4 (1) the number, variety, and quality of an
- 5 institution's undergraduate, graduate, postgraduate, and
- 6 professional degree programs, the number of programs accredited by
- 7 a recognized accrediting agency or recognized nationally, the
- 8 institution's selectivity in admissions to each program, the
- 9 standard time required for a student to obtain a degree in each
- 10 program, the institution's graduation rates in each program, and
- 11 the institution's faculty-to-student classroom ratios;
- 12 (2) the degree to which writing and critical thought
- 13 are incorporated as elements in each undergraduate degree program,
- 14 the number of graduates of each undergraduate degree program who
- 15 enroll in selective graduate, postgraduate, and professional
- degree programs, the level of graduate performance on licensing
- 17 examinations, the number, variety, and quality of honors programs
- 18 available at the institution, whether honors theses are required
- 19 for participation in those honors programs, and the availability of
- 20 independent study credits at the institution;
- 21 (3) the number of doctoral degrees awarded by the
- 22 <u>institution</u>, the number, variety, and quality of the programs in
- 23 which those degrees are awarded, and the number of students
- 24 enrolled in each program;
- 25 (4) the degree of faculty and student engagement in
- 26 <u>research and other creative activities</u>, the number of faculty and
- 27 students who engage in those activities, the resources applied by

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- 1 the institution to those activities, the number, variety, and
- 2 quality of degree programs in which those activities occur, the
- 3 success of the institution in receiving federal research and
- 4 development funding, and the number of faculty who are members of
- 5 nationally recognized academic associations such as the National
- 6 Academy of Sciences or the National Academy of Engineering;
- 7 (5) the quality of the libraries of the institution;
- 8 (6) the amount of institutional endowment and state
- 9 revenue available on behalf of each student;
- 10 <u>(7) whether the institution is a member of the</u>
- 11 Association of American Universities, the Association of Research
- 12 Libraries, or another similar entity that recognizes institutional
- 13 excellence on a national level; and
- 14 (8) alumni involvement in institution activities.
- 15 (c) In prescribing the criteria for purposes of Subsection
- 16 (a), the board must include any criteria the commissioner of higher
- 17 education considers appropriate to achieve the purposes of this
- 18 section.
- 19 (d) The board shall administer this section with the
- 20 assistance of an advisory committee composed of at least five but
- 21 <u>not more than 15 higher education experts or scholars from any</u>
- 22 state. The commissioner of higher education shall select the
- 23 members of the advisory committee. Chapter 2110, Government Code,
- 24 does not apply to the advisory committee.
- 25 (e) Not later than October 1, 2006, the board shall
- 26 establish the initial criteria and make its initial determinations
- 27 under this section and report the board's actions to each

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- 1 legislative standing committee and subcommittee with primary
- 2 jurisdiction over higher education. This subsection expires
- 3 <u>January 1, 2007.</u>
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
