4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education Code, is

6 amended by adding Section 55.17513 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 55.17513. TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY SYSTEM; ADDITIONAL

BONDS. (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this

subchapter, the board of regents of The Texas A&M University System

may acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate, enlarge, or

equip facilities, including roads and related infrastructure, for a

12 kinesiology and wellness center, a college of business academic

facility, and distribution of utilities for Texas A&M

14 University--Corpus Christi, to be financed by the issuance of bonds

15 in accordance with this subchapter, including bonds issued in

accordance with a systemwide revenue financing program and secured

as provided by that program, in an aggregate principal amount not to

exceed \$58 million.

(b) The board of regents may pledge irrevocably to the

payment of the bonds authorized by this section all or any part of

the revenue funds of an institution, branch, or entity of The Texas

22 A&M University System, including student tuition charges. The

23 amount of a pledge made under this subsection may not be reduced or

abrogated while the bonds for which the pledge is made, or bonds

- 2 (c) If sufficient funds are not available to the board of

- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
