## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the TexasNextStep grant program to pay
3	tuition and required fees and textbook costs of certain students
4	enrolled in two-year public institutions of higher education in
5	this state.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Subchapter R to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER R. TEXASNEXTSTEP GRANT PROGRAM
10	Sec. 56.481. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
12	Education Coordinating Board.
13	(2) "Eligible institution" means:
14	(A) a public junior college;
15	(B) a public technical institute; or
16	(C) a public state college.
17	(3) "Institution of higher education," "public junior
18	college," "public technical institute," and "public state college"
19	have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
20	(4) "Textbook costs" means the costs of textbooks and
21	similar educational materials required for course work at an
22	eligible institution.
23	Sec. 56.482. PROGRAM NAME; PURPOSE. (a) The student
24	financial assistance program authorized by this subchapter is known

as the TexasNextStep grant program, and an individual grant awarded
under this subchapter is known as a TexasNextStep grant.

3 (b) The purpose of this subchapter is to provide a grant of 4 money to enable eligible students to attend two-year public 5 institutions of higher education in this state.

6 <u>Sec. 56.483. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM.</u> (a) The 7 <u>coordinating board shall administer the TexasNextStep grant</u> 8 <u>program and shall adopt any rules necessary to implement the</u> 9 <u>TexasNextStep grant program or this subchapter. The coordinating</u> 10 <u>board shall consult with the student financial aid officers of</u> 11 <u>eligible institutions in developing the rules.</u>

12 (b) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to provide a 13 TexasNextStep grant to an eligible student enrolled in an eligible 14 institution in a manner consistent with the administration of 15 federal student financial aid programs.

(c) The total amount of grants awarded under the
TexasNextStep grant program may not exceed the amount available for
the program from appropriations, gifts, grants, or other funds.

19 <u>Sec. 56.484. INITIAL ELIGIBILITY FOR GRANT. (a) To be</u> 20 <u>eligible initially for a grant under the TexasNextStep grant</u> 21 program, a person must:

22 (1) be a resident of this state as determined by 23 <u>coordinating board rules;</u>

24 (2) not later than the 16th month after the month in 25 which the person graduated from high school, enroll or have 26 enrolled as an entering student for at least one-half of a full 27 course load for an entering student, as determined by the

1	coordinating board, in an associate degree or certificate program
2	at an eligible institution;
3	(3) have graduated from:
4	(A) a public high school in this state; or
5	(B) an accredited private high school or a home
6	school or other nontraditional educational program in this state;
7	(4) have applied for any available financial aid or
8	assistance;
9	(5) meet eligibility requirements necessary to
10	receive federal student financial aid, other than requirements
11	regarding financial need; and
12	(6) comply with any additional nonacademic
13	requirement adopted by the coordinating board under this
14	subchapter.
15	(b) A person is not eligible to receive a TexasNextStep
16	grant if the person:
17	(1) has been granted an associate or baccalaureate
18	degree; or
19	(2) is concurrently enrolled in an institution of
20	higher education other than an eligible institution, unless the
21	person is enrolled in the person's final semester or term at the
22	eligible institution before completing the person's associate
23	degree or certificate program and the person enrolls in one or more
24	courses that, if successfully completed, would allow the person to
25	complete the degree or certificate requirements.
26	(c) A person may not receive a TexasNextStep grant for more
27	than 90 semester credit hours or the equivalent, including any

developmental course work required by an eligible institution. 1 (d) Subject to Section 56.487(b)(2), a person may receive a 2 3 TexasNextStep grant regardless of whether the person is eligible 4 for a TEXAS grant or a TEXAS grant II. 5 (e) A person may not receive a TexasNextStep grant for a 6 semester or term that begins on or after the third anniversary of 7 the initial award of a TexasNextStep grant to the person. 8 Sec. 56.485. CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS. (a) After initially qualifying for a 9 TexasNextStep grant, a person may continue to receive a 10 TexasNextStep grant during each semester or term in which the 11 person is enrolled at an eligible institution only if the person: 12 13 (1) is enrolled in an associate degree or certificate program at an eligible institution; 14 15 (2) except as provided by Subsection (b), is enrolled 16 for at least one-half of a full course load for a student in an 17 associate degree or certificate program, as determined by the 18 coordinating board; (3) makes satisfactory academic progress toward an 19 20 associate degree or certificate; (4) meets eligibility requirements necessary to 21 22 receive federal student financial aid, other than requirements regarding f<u>inancial need; and</u> 23 (5) complies with any additional nonacademic 24 25 requirement adopted by the coordinating board. (b) A person is exempt from the one-half course load 26 requirement of Subsection (a)(2) if the TexasNextStep grant is 27

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1	awarded for the person's final semester or term before the person
2	completes the person's degree or certificate program and the person
3	enrolls in one or more courses that, if successfully completed,
4	would allow the person to complete the degree or certificate
5	requirements. A person who qualifies for an exemption under this
6	subsection is not eligible for a TexasNextStep grant in a
7	subsequent semester or term, regardless of whether the person
8	graduates as planned.
9	(c) If a person fails to meet any of the requirements of
10	Subsection (a) after the completion of any semester or term, the
11	person may not receive a TexasNextStep grant during the next
12	semester or term in which the person enrolls. A person may become
13	eligible to receive a TexasNextStep grant in a subsequent semester
14	or term if the person:
15	(1) completes a semester or term during which the
16	person is not eligible for the grant; and
17	(2) meets all the requirements of Subsection (a).
18	(d) For purposes of this section, a person makes
19	satisfactory academic progress toward an associate degree or
20	certificate only if the person meets the standards for academic
21	progress as determined by the eligible institution.
22	(e) A person's eligibility to receive a TexasNextStep grant
23	is not affected by the person's enrollment in or transfer to another
24	eligible institution.
25	Sec. 56.486. GRANT USE. A person receiving a TexasNextStep
26	grant may use the money to pay any usual and customary cost of
27	attendance at an eligible institution incurred by the person. The

1	institution may disburse all or part of the proceeds of a
2	TexasNextStep grant to an eligible person only if the tuition and
3	required fees incurred by the person at the institution have been
4	paid.
5	Sec. 56.487. GRANT AMOUNT. (a) The amount of a
6	TexasNextStep grant for a student enrolled full-time at an eligible
7	institution is \$30 per semester credit hour for textbooks and the
8	amount determined by the coordinating board as the average amount
9	of tuition and required fees and that a resident student enrolled
10	full-time in an associate degree or certificate program would be
11	charged for that semester or term at the institution, except that if
12	the eligible institution is a public junior college, the average
13	amount of those charges shall be computed without including the
14	portion of tuition and required fees charged only to a student who
15	resides outside the junior college district.
16	(b) The coordinating board shall adopt rules that:
17	(1) allow the coordinating board to increase or
18	decrease, in proportion to the number of semester credit hours in
19	which a student is enrolled, the amount of a TexasNextStep grant
20	award under this section to a student who is enrolled in a number of
21	semester credit hours in excess of or below the number of semester
22	credit hours described in Section 56.484(a)(2) or 56.485(a)(2); and
23	(2) require the coordinating board to reduce the

24 <u>amount of a TexasNextStep grant by the amount of any state or</u> 25 <u>federal gift aid for which the person receiving the grant is</u> 26 <u>eligible if that aid could be applied, according to the terms of the</u> 27 <u>aid, toward the person's tuition and required fees and textbook</u>

1	costs at \$30 per semester credit hour at the eligible institution.
2	(c) Not later than January 31 of each year, the coordinating
3	board shall publish the amounts of each grant established by the
4	board with respect to an eligible institution for the academic year
5	beginning the next fall semester.
6	(d) An eligible institution may not:
7	(1) charge a person attending the institution who also
8	receives a TexasNextStep grant an amount of tuition and required
9	fees in excess of the amount of the TexasNextStep grant received by
10	the person for tuition and required fees, except that if the
11	eligible institution is a public junior college, the institution
12	may charge an additional amount to the person based on the person's
13	residence outside the junior college district; or
14	(2) deny admission to or enrollment in the institution
15	based on a person's eligibility to receive a TexasNextStep grant or
16	a person's receipt of a TexasNextStep grant.
17	Sec. 56.488. BIENNIAL REPORT. The coordinating board
18	shall:
19	(1) for each eligible institution, track the academic
20	performance of and subsequent levels of education attained by grant
21	recipients; and
22	(2) report the data biennially to the legislature and
23	the comptroller.
24	SECTION 2. (a) Section 1 of this Act applies beginning
25	with the 2005-2006 academic year, except that the Texas Higher
26	Education Coordinating Board may not award a TexasNextStep grant
27	under Subchapter R, Chapter 56, Education Code, as added by this

Act, to an entering student who enrolls in an eligible institution
before the 2006-2007 academic year.

3 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 4 adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter R, Chapter 56, 5 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after 6 this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may 7 adopt the initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency 8 rules. This subsection expires September 1, 2006.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
