A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study of affordable housing needs and potential
3	revenue sources for affordable housing.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter K, Chapter 2306, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 2306.260 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2306.260. STUDY REGARDING AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDS AND
8	FUNDING. (a) The department shall conduct a study of affordable
9	housing needs and potential revenue sources for affordable housing
10	in this state. The study must:
11	(1) include an overview of the affordable housing
12	needs in this state;
13	(2) estimate the amount of appropriations from general
14	revenue that will be needed annually to address those affordable
15	housing needs;
16	(3) identify and evaluate potential revenue sources
17	other than appropriations from general revenue that could be
18	dedicated to the housing trust fund for use in developing
19	affordable housing in this state;
20	(4) evaluate the impact that a dedicated source of
21	revenue for the housing trust fund could have on the state economy,
22	including the impact on:
23	(A) jobs and income;
24	(B) industry sectors;

1	(C) tax revenues; and
2	(D) spending by households that benefit from
3	increased access to affordable housing; and
4	(5) evaluate potential social and community benefits
5	that may result from increased investment in the housing trust
6	<pre>fund, including:</pre>
7	(A) increased family stability and household
8	wealth;
9	(B) improvements in public health;
LO	(C) lower dropout rates in schools;
L1	(D) lower unemployment rates;
L2	(E) environmental benefits; and
L3	(F) increased economic development.
L4	(b) The evaluation of potential revenue sources under
L5	Subsection (a) (3) must include:
L6	(1) an estimate of:
L7	(A) the amount of money that could be raised
L8	through the revenue source; and
L9	(B) the ease or difficulty of administration and
20	distribution of the money; and
21	(2) an evaluation of whether the revenue source:
22	(A) has a logical relationship to the development
23	of affordable housing;
24	(B) is regressive or progressive, if the revenue
25	source is a tax or a fee; and
26	(C) could lead to the leveraging of other revenue
7	sources or would meet requirements for federal housing matching

- 2 (c) The department may contract with an appropriate
- 3 independent organization and institutions of higher education
- 4 specializing in affordable housing or economic development
- 5 research to conduct the study on the department's behalf.
- 6 (d) The department shall report to the governor, the
- 7 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 8 representatives on the study and its results not later than
- 9 September 1, 2006.
- 10 (e) To conduct the study, the department or organization may
- 11 use money available under Section 1372.006(a-1) and may seek and
- 12 <u>accept grants or donations.</u>
- 13 (f) This section expires February 1, 2007.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 1372.006, Government Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 16 (a-1) In addition to being used in the affordable housing
- 17 research and information program, money transferred to the Texas
- 18 Department of Housing and Community Affairs may be used by the
- 19 department to conduct the study regarding affordable housing needs
- 20 and funding, as provided by Section 2306.260. This subsection
- 21 expires February 1, 2007.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
