## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to county authority to adopt fire codes in unincorporated areas.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 233.062(a), Local Government Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The fire code applies only to the following buildings 8 constructed in an unincorporated area of the county:
  - (1) a commercial establishment; [and]
- 10 (2) a public building; and
- 11 (3) a multi-family dwelling.
- 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 233, Local Government
- 13 Code, is amended by adding Section 233.0625 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 233.0625. CONFLICT WITH EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT
- 15 FIRE CODE. To the extent of a conflict between a fire code adopted
- 16 under this subchapter and a fire code adopted under Chapter 775,
- 17 Health and Safety Code, the fire code adopted under this subchapter
- 18 <u>controls.</u>

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- 19 SECTION 3. Section 233.064, Local Government Code, is
- 20 amended by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (g) to
- 21 read as follows:
- (e) The county shall begin the inspection of the building
- 23 within 10 business [two] days after the date of the receipt of the
- 24 written inspection request. If an inspection is properly requested

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- 1 and the county does not begin the inspection within the time
- 2 permitted by this subsection, the building that is the subject of
- 3 the request is considered approved for the purposes of this
- 4 subchapter.
- 5 (g) If the inspector determines, after an inspection of the
- 6 completed building, that the building does not comply with the fire
- 7 <u>code:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) the county shall deny the certificate of</u>
- 9 <u>compliance; and</u>
- 10 (2) the building may not be occupied.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
