8	IMPROPER BENEFITS. (a) A person who has received improper benefits
9	is liable for the amount of the improper benefits. The commission
10	may recover improper benefits by:
11	(1) deducting the amount of the improper benefits from
12	any future benefits payable to the person;
13	(2) employing a private collection agency to seek
14	repayment of the amount of the improper benefits; or
15	(3) [(2)] collecting the amount of the improper
16	benefits for the compensation fund in the same manner provided by
17	Sections 213.031, 213.032, 213.033, 213.035, and 213.051 for the
18	collection of past due contributions.
19	(b) In this section, "improper benefit" means <u>any</u> [ <del>the</del> ]

1	misrepresentation by the person or by another of a material fact,
2	without regard to whether the nondisclosure or misrepresentation
3	was known or fraudulent; and
4	[ <del>(2) while:</del>
5	[(A) any condition imposed by this subtitle for
6	the person's qualifying for the benefit was not fulfilled in the
7	person's case; or
8	[ <del>(B) the person was disqualified from receiving</del>
9	benefits].
10	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
11	unemployment compensation benefits based on a claim that is filed
12	with the Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective date
13	of this Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is
14	governed by the law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and
15	the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
16	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
