## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the applicability of certain weapons laws to certain 3 prosecutors licensed to carry a concealed handgun. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Amend Section 46.15, Penal Code, by amending 5 Subsections (4) and (5) and adding Subsection (6) to read as 6 follows: 7 Sec. 46.15. NONAPPLICABILITY. 8 (a) Sections 46.02 and 46.03 do not apply to: 9 peace officers, including commissioned 10 (1)peace officers of a recognized state, or special investigators under 11 Article 2.122, Code of Criminal Procedure, and neither section 12 13 prohibits a peace officer or special investigator from carrying a weapon in this state, including in an establishment in this state 14 serving the public, regardless of whether the peace officer or 15 special investigator is engaged in the actual discharge of the 16 officer's or investigator's duties while carrying the weapon; 17 parole officers and neither section prohibits an 18 (2) officer from carrying a weapon in this state if the officer is: 19 engaged in the actual discharge of 20 (A) the officer's duties while carrying the weapon; and 21 22 (B) in compliance with policies and procedures 23 adopted by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice regarding the 24 possession of a weapon by an officer while on duty;

1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the 6 legislative session.
