2	relating to a financial literacy pilot program in public schools.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 29.915 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 29.915. FINANCIAL LITERACY PILOT PROGRAM. (a) In this
7	section, "program" means the financial literacy pilot program.
8	(b) To the extent funding is available under Subsection (e),
9	the agency by rule shall establish and implement a financial
10	literacy pilot program to provide students in participating school
11	districts with the knowledge and skills necessary as
12	self-supporting adults to make critical decisions relating to
13	personal financial matters.
14	(c) The agency shall collaborate with the Office of Consumer
15	Credit Commissioner and the State Securities Board to develop the
16	curriculum and instructional materials for the program. The
17	curriculum and instructional materials must include information
18	about:
19	(1) avoiding and eliminating credit card debt;
20	(2) managing money to make the transition from renting
21	a home to home ownership;
22	(3) starting a small business;
23	(4) being a prudent investor in the stock market and
24	using other investment options;

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1	(5) beginning a savings program;
2	(6) bankruptcy;
3	(7) the types of bank accounts available to consumers
4	and the benefits of maintaining a bank account; and
5	(8) the types of loans available to consumers and
6	becoming a low-risk borrower.
7	(d) The agency shall develop an application and selection
8	process for selecting school districts to participate in the
9	program. The agency may select not more than five school districts
10	to participate in the program.
11	(e) The agency may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or
12	donation from any source, including a foundation, private entity,
13	governmental entity, or institution of higher education, for the
14	implementation of the program. The program may be implemented only
15	if sufficient funds are available under this subsection for that
16	purpose.
17	(f) Not later than January 1, 2007, the agency shall provide
18	each member of the legislature with a report relating to the
19	implementation and effectiveness of the program. This subsection
20	expires February 1, 2007.
21	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
22	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
23	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
24	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
25	Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
