A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to wine and beer retailer's permits. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 11.393(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person who 6 submits an original application for a private club registration 7 permit or a permit authorizing the retail sale of alcoholic 8 beverages for on-premises consumption shall give written notice of 9 the application to each residential address and established 10 11 neighborhood association any point on the property line of which is 12 less than [located within] 300 feet from [of] any point on the property line of the premises for which the permit is sought, as 13 14 measured in a straight line. SECTION 2. Section 11.43(c), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 15

amended to read as follows: 16

(c) A hearing shall be held on any renewal application of a 17 18 mixed beverage permit, private club registration permit, wine and beer retailer's permit, or retail dealer's on-premise license if a 19 sexually oriented business is to be operated on the premises to be 20 21 covered by the permit or license and a petition is presented to the 22 commission requesting a hearing which is signed by 50 percent of the 23 residents who reside on property any point on the property line of which is less than [within] 300 feet from [of] any point on the 24

S.B. No. 860 property line of the affected premises, as measured in a straight 1 2 line. 3 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 11, Alcoholic Beverage 4 Code, is amended by adding Section 11.461 to read as follows: 5 Sec. 11.461. CERTAIN WINE AND BEER RETAILER'S PERMITS: 6 ADDITIONAL GROUNDS FOR REFUSAL TO RENEW. (a) This section applies 7 only to a wine and beer retailer's permit for premises located in a munic<u>ipality:</u> 8 9 (1) with a population of 1.5 million or more; and (2) that has not adopted a comprehensive zoning 10 ordinance under Subchapter A, Chapter 211, Local Government Code. 11 12 (b) The commission or administrator may refuse to issue a renewal wine and beer retailer's permit for a premises located 13 within 300 feet of a church, school, or day-care center or 14 15 child-care facility, as that distance is determined under Sections 109.33 and 109.331, if the commission or administrator determines 16 17 after a hearing that the operation of the premises has an adverse effect on the health, safety, or welfare of individuals attending 18 19 the church, school, or day-care center or child-care facility. SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 11, Alcoholic Beverage 20 21 Code, is amended by adding Section 11.481 to read as follows: Sec. 11.481. REFUSAL OF WINE AND BEER RETAILER'S PERMIT: 22 CERTAIN RELATIVES OF CERTAIN APPLICANTS. If the commission, 23 24 administrator, or county judge refuses to issue or renew or cancels a wine and beer retailer's permit, an original wine and beer 25 26 retailer's permit for the same premises may not be issued to an individual related to the former permit holder or applicant within 27

1	the fourth degree by consanguinity or affinity, as determined under
2	Chapter 573, Government Code.
3	SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 11, Alcoholic Beverage
4	Code, is amended by adding Section 11.614 to read as follows:
5	Sec. 11.614. CANCELLATION OF CERTAIN WINE AND BEER
6	RETAILER'S PERMITS. (a) In this section, "residential area" has
7	the meaning assigned by Section 244.001, Local Government Code.
8	(b) This section applies only to a wine and beer retailer's
9	permit for premises located in a residential area in a
10	municipality:
11	(1) with a population of 1.5 million or more; and
12	(2) that has not adopted a comprehensive zoning
13	ordinance under Subchapter A, Chapter 211, Local Government Code.
14	(c) The commission, the administrator, or the county judge,
15	as applicable, shall hold a hearing under this subchapter to
16	determine whether a wine and beer retailer's permit should be
17	canceled if the commission receives a petition that:
18	(1) alleges a ground for cancellation under Section
19	<u>11.61;</u>
20	<u>(2) is:</u>
21	(A) signed by 25 percent of the owners or tenants
22	of real property within 300 feet of any point on the property line
23	of the permitted premises; or
24	(B) submitted by the state senator or
25	representative who represents the district in which the premises
26	are located, the chief of police, mayor, or a member of the city
27	council of the municipality in which the premises are located, or

1	the sheriff of the county in which the premises are located; and
2	(3) is accompanied by the sworn statement of at least
3	one credible person supporting the grounds alleged in the petition.
4	SECTION 6. Section 25.02, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 25.02. FEE. Except as provided in Section 25.03 [of
7	this code], the [annual] state fee for a wine and beer retailer's
8	permit is <u>:</u>
9	(1) \$1,000 for an original permit; and
10	(2) \$175 annually for a renewal permit.
11	SECTION 7. Chapter 25, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
12	by adding Section 25.055 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 25.055. PREMISES IN RESIDENTIAL AREA: ADDITIONAL
14	NOTICE REQUIREMENTS. (a) In addition to any other notice required
15	by this code, and notwithstanding Section 11.393(b), a person who
16	submits an application for an original or renewal wine and beer
17	retailer's permit for premises located in a residential area, as
18	that term is defined by Section 244.001, Local Government Code,
19	shall give notice of the application to:
20	(1) all tenants and owners of real property located
21	less than 300 feet from any point on the property line of the
22	premises, as measured in a straight line;
23	(2) the sheriff of the county in which the premises are
24	<pre>located;</pre>
25	(3) the chief of police, mayor, and members of the
26	governing body of the incorporated city in which the premises are
27	located; and

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1	(4) the state senator and state representative
2	representing the district in which the premises are located.
3	(b) Notice required by Subsection (a) must be:
4	(1) delivered by mail at the applicant's expense;
5	(2) provided in English and a language other than
6	English if it is likely that a substantial number of residents in
7	the area speak a language other than English as their familiar
8	language; and
9	(3) provided on or before:
10	(A) the fifth day after the date on which the
11	applicant files the application, if the application is an original
12	application; or
13	(B) the 30th day before the expiration date of a
14	permit for which the applicant files a renewal application.
15	(c) The notice must be provided on a form prescribed by the
16	commission and must contain:
17	(1) the type of permit and type of business for which
18	the applicant has applied;
19	(2) the exact location of the place of business for
20	which the permit is sought;
21	(3) the name of each owner of the business or, if the
22	business is operated under an assumed name, the trade name and the
23	name of each owner;
24	(4) if the applicant is a corporation, the name and
25	title of each officer of the corporation; and
26	(5) a description of the procedure for protesting the
27	application.

1	(d) In addition to any other notice required by this code,
2	the commission, administrator, or county judge, as appropriate,
3	shall give notice of all hearings concerning an original or renewal
4	application for a wine and beer retailer's permit to each person
5	entitled to notice under Subsection (a). Notwithstanding Section
6	11.40, if hearings concerning the application are held by the
7	commission or administrator, the commission or administrator shall
8	also give notice under this subsection to the county judge of the
9	county in which the premises for which the permit is sought are
10	located.
11	SECTION 8. Chapter 25, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
12	by adding Section 25.07 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 25.07. LIMITATION ON ISSUANCE OF PERMITS IN CERTAIN
14	MUNICIPALITIES. (a) In this section, "residential area" has the
15	meaning assigned by Section 244.001, Local Government Code.
16	(b) This section applies only to a municipality:
17	(1) with a population of 1.5 million or more; and
18	(2) that has not adopted a comprehensive zoning
19	ordinance under Subchapter A, Chapter 211, Local Government Code.
20	(c) The governing body of the municipality may adopt
21	regulations limiting the number of wine and beer retailers that may
22	operate in a zip code area located wholly or partly within the
23	municipality if the zip code area consists primarily of real
24	property in residential areas. A regulation adopted under this
25	subsection for a zip code area only partly located in the
26	municipality applies only to the area located in the municipality.
27	(d) A regulation adopted under this section may prescribe a

1	limit for a zip code area that is fewer than the number of wine and
2	beer retailers operating in the zip code area at the time the
3	regulation is adopted, but a regulation adopted under this section
4	does not affect the authority of a person who holds a wine and beer
5	retailer's permit at the time the regulation is adopted to continue
6	to operate under that permit or to renew that permit.
7	(e) The county judge shall deny an application for an
8	original application for a wine and beer retailer's permit if, at
9	the time the application is filed, the number of wine and beer
10	retailers operating in the zip code area for the premises for which
11	the permit is sought equals or exceeds the number of wine and beer
12	retailers allowed in that zip code area by a regulation adopted
13	under this section.
14	SECTION 9. Chapter 25, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
15	by adding Section 25.14 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 25.14. HOURS OF OPERATION OF CERTAIN PERMIT HOLDERS.
17	(a) In this section, "residential area" has the meaning prescribed
18	by Section 244.001, Local Government Code.
19	(b) This section applies only to the holder of a beer and
20	wine retailer's permit for premises located in a residential area
21	in a municipality:
22	(1) with a population of 1.5 million or more; and
23	(2) that has not adopted zoning regulations or a
24	comprehensive zoning ordinance under Subchapter A, Chapter 211,
25	Local Government Code.
26	(c) The holder of a beer and wine retailer's permit may not
27	allow any customer on the premises after 2 a.m.

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SECTION 10. Section 61.382(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows:

Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person who 3 (a) submits an original application for a license authorizing the 4 5 retail sale of beer for on-premises consumption shall give written 6 notice of the application to each residential address and 7 established neighborhood association any point on the property line 8 of which is less than [located within] 300 feet from [of] any point 9 on the property line of the premises for which the license is 10 sought, as measured in a straight line.

SECTION 11. Section 109.33, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:

Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), the [The] 14 (b) 15 measurement of the distance between the place of business where alcoholic beverages are sold and the church or public hospital 16 17 shall be along the property lines of the street fronts and from front door to front door, and in direct line across intersections. 18 Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), the [The] measurement of 19 the distance between the place of business where alcoholic 20 21 beverages are sold and the public or private school shall be:

(1) in a direct line from the property line of the
public or private school to the property line of the place of
business, and in a direct line across intersections; or

(2) if the permit or license holder is located on or
above the fifth story of a multistory building, in a direct line
from the property line of the public or private school to the

property line of the place of business, in a direct line across intersections, and vertically up the building at the property line to the base of the floor on which the permit or license holder is located.

5 (b-1) This subsection applies only to regulations enacted 6 by a municipality with a population of 1.5 million or more that has not adopted a comprehensive zoning ordinance under Subchapter A, 7 Chapter 211, Local Government Code. Except as provided by this 8 subsection, for the purposes of this section, the distance between 9 a particular property and a premises for which a wine and beer 10 retailer's permit is held or sought is the distance between the 11 12 point on the property line of the particular property and the point on the property line of the permitted or potentially permitted 13 14 premises that are nearest each other, as measured in a straight 15 line. For the purposes of a regulation enacted under Subsection (a), the distance between a particular property and a premises for 16 which a wine and beer retailer's permit is originally granted 17 before September 1, 2005, is determined by the law in effect at the 18 time the original permit was granted. 19

20 SECTION 12. Subchapter C, Chapter 109, Alcoholic Beverage 21 Code, is amended by adding Section 109.332 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 109.332. CERTAIN BEER AND WINE RETAILERS: SALES NEAR</u>
23 <u>CERTAIN YOUTH-ORIENTED FACILITIES. (a) This section applies only</u>
24 <u>to the holder of a beer and wine retailer's permit for premises</u>
25 <u>located in a municipality:</u>

26	(1)	with	a pop	ulati	on of 1.5	million	or more; and		
27	(2)	that	has	not	adopted	zoning	regulations	or	a

1 comprehensive zoning ordinance under Subchapter A, Chapter 211,
2 Local Government Code.
3 (b) Except as provided by this subsection, the provisions of
4 Section 109.33 relating to the location of a permitted premises
5 with respect to a public school also apply to the location of a beer

and wine retailer's premises with respect to a playground, video
arcade facility, or public or private youth center, as those terms
are defined by Section 481.134, Health and Safety Code, or a public
swimming pool. Sections 109.33(a)(2) and (c) do not apply to the
location of a beer and wine retailer's premises with respect to the
other premises listed in this subsection.

Sections 11.461 and 109.332, Alcoholic SECTION 13. 12 (a) Beverage Code, as added by this Act, apply only to an application 13 for an original or renewal wine and beer retailer's permit that is 14 15 filed or pending on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for an original or renewal wine and beer retailer's 16 permit that is filed and approved before the effective date of this 17 Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, 18 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 19

(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c) of this section, 20 Sections 11.393, 25.02, 61.382, and 109.33, Alcoholic Beverage 21 Code, as amended by this Act, and Sections 11.481 and 25.055, 22 Alcoholic Beverage Code, as added by this Act, apply only to an 23 24 application for an original or renewal wine and beer retailer's 25 permit that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An application filed before the effective date of this Act is governed 26 by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is 27

1 continued in effect for that purpose.

(c) Section 25.055(d), Alcoholic Beverage Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a hearing concerning an application for a wine and beer retailer's permit that occurs on or after November 1, 2005. A hearing held before November 1, 2005, is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect immediately if it 9 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 10 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 11 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 12 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
