A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the administration of promotional examinations to 3 certain firefighters and police officers who are members of the 4 armed forces on active duty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 143.032, Local Government Code, is 7 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (j) to 8 read as follows:

9 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (j), each [Each] 10 eligible promotional candidate shall be given an identical 11 examination in the presence of the other eligible promotional 12 candidates.

13 (j) If an eligible promotional candidate who is serving on active military duty is unable to take the examination in the 14 presence of the other eligible promotional candidates because of 15 circumstances related to the candidate's service on active military 16 duty, the candidate may take the examination outside of the 17 presence of the other candidates and at a different time than the 18 other candidates. The commission may adopt rules under Subsection 19 (a) providing for the efficient administration of promotional 20 examinations to eligible promotional candidates who are members of 21 22 the armed forces serving on active military duty. The rules shall require that, if a candidate serving on active military duty takes a 23 24 promotional examination outside the presence of other candidates

| 4 | SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 143.028, Local |

| 8 | provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this |
| 9 | Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this |
| 10 | Act takes effect September 1, 2005. |
