- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 255.003(a) and (f), Health and Safety
- 10 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The department shall establish regional offices with
- 12 one or more quality-of-care monitors, based on the number of
- 13 long-term care facilities in the region, to monitor the facilities
- 14 in the region on a regular, [unannounced,] aperiodic basis,
- including nights, evenings, weekends, and holidays. A monitoring
- visit conducted under this chapter may be announced or unannounced.
- 17 (f) The quality-of-care monitor shall include in  $\underline{a}$
- 18 <u>monitoring</u> [an assessment] visit:
- 19 (1) observation of the care and services rendered to
