- 2 relating to the name, functions, and duties of the Texas Council on
- 3 Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 114, Human Resources
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 114. TEXAS [INTERACENCY] COUNCIL ON AUTISM AND PERVASIVE
- 8 DEVELOPMENTAL DISORDERS
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 114.001, Human Resources Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 114.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as
- 12 the Texas [Interagency] Council on Autism and Pervasive
- 13 Developmental Disorders Act of 1987.
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 114.002, Human Resources Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 114.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 17 (1) "Autism and other pervasive developmental
- 18 disorders" means a subclass of mental disorders characterized by
- 19 distortions in the development of multiple basic psychological
- 20 functions that are involved in the development of social skills and
- 21 language, as defined by the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual, 4th
- 22 [3rd] Edition.
- 23 (2) "Council" means the Texas [Interagency] Council on
- 24 Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders.

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- 1 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 114.003, Human Resources
- 2 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 114.003. [INTERACENCY] COUNCIL.
- 4 SECTION 5. Sections 114.003(a) and (b), Human Resources
- 5 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The <u>Texas</u> [<u>Interagency</u>] Council on Autism and Pervasive
- 7 Developmental Disorders is established.
- 8 (b) The council is composed of:
- 9 (1) seven public members, the majority of whom are
- 10 family members of a person with autism or a pervasive developmental
- 11 disorder, appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of
- 12 the senate; and
- 13 (2) one representative from each of the following
- 14 state agencies, to serve as ex officio members:
- 15 (A) [Texas] Department of Aging and Disability
- 16 Services [Mental Health and Mental Retardation];
- 17 (B) [Texas] Department of State Health Services;
- 18 (C) Health and [Texas Department of] Human
- 19 Services Commission;
- 20 (D) Texas Education Agency;
- 21 (E) <u>Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative</u>
- 22 Services [Texas Rehabilitation Commission]; and
- 23 (F) <u>Department of Family Protective Services</u>
- 24 [Interagency Council on Early Childhood Intervention].
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 114.004, Human Resources Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 114.004. STAFF SUPPORT. The agencies represented on

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- 1 the council shall provide staff support to the council from among
- 2 the agency staff who are responsible for coordinating services to
- 3 persons with autism or other pervasive developmental disorders or
- 4 to those persons' families. The council may require the employment
- of staff to carry out the responsibilities of the council [perform
- 6 clerical duties]. The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 7 [Texas Department of] Human Services Commission shall determine
- 8 which agency must employ [clerical] staff for the council and what
- 9 funding resources shall be used for the council.
- 10 SECTION 7. Section 114.005, Human Resources Code, is
- amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (b) The chair of the council [task force] shall appoint the
- 14 chair of the task force [elect its own chairperson] and the task
- 15 force shall meet and serve in accordance with council rules. The
- 16 council may divide the task force into regional committees to
- 17 assist the council in community level program planning and
- 18 implementation.
- (c) A member of the task force may be appointed or removed
- 20 without cause by a majority vote of the public members of the
- 21 <u>council present at a council meeting.</u>
- 22 SECTION 8. Sections 114.007(a), (b), and (c), Human
- 23 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) The council shall provide recommendations to the Health
- 25 and Human Services Commission and other appropriate state agencies
- 26 [Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation as the
- 27 state agency primarily | responsible for implementing this chapter,

- 1 including recommendations relating to the use of funds appropriated
- 2 to the commission or another health and human services agency
- 3 [department] to provide services to persons with autism or other
- 4 pervasive developmental disorders.
- 5 (b) The council with the advice of the advisory task force
- 6 and input from people with autism and other pervasive developmental
- 7 <u>disorders</u>, their families, and related advocacy organizations
- 8 shall address contemporary issues affecting services available to
- 9 persons with autism or other pervasive developmental disorders in
- 10 this state, including:
- 11 (1) successful intervention and treatment strategies,
- 12 including transitioning;
- 13 (2) personnel preparation and continuing education;
- 14 (3) referral, screening, and evaluation services;
- 15 (4) day care, respite care, or residential care
- 16 services;
- 17 (5) vocational and adult training programs;
- 18 (6) public awareness strategies;
- 19 (7) contemporary research;
- 20 (8) early identification strategies;
- 21 (9) family counseling and case management; and
- 22 (10) recommendations for monitoring autism service
- 23 programs.
- (c) The council with the advice of the advisory task force
- 25 and input from people with autism and other pervasive developmental
- 26 disorders, their families, and related advocacy organizations
- 27 shall advise the legislature on legislation that is needed to

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- 1 develop further and to maintain a statewide system of quality
- 2 intervention and treatment services for all persons with autism or
- 3 other pervasive developmental disorders. The council may develop
- 4 and recommend legislation to the legislature or comment on pending
- 5 legislation that affects those persons.
- 6 SECTION 9. Section 114.008, Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 114.008. REPORT. (a) The agencies represented on
- 9 the council and the public members shall report to the council any
- 10 requirements identified by the agency or person to provide
- 11 additional or improved services to persons with autism or other
- 12 pervasive developmental disorders. Not later than November 1 of
- 13 each year, the council shall prepare and deliver to the executive
- 14 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission, the
- 15 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 16 representatives a report summarizing the recommendations.
- 17 (b) The council shall develop a strategy for establishing
- 18 new programs to meet the requirements identified through the
- 19 <u>council's review and assessment and from input from the task force</u>,
- 20 people with autism and related pervasive developmental disorders,
- 21 their families, and related advocacy organizations [by the agencies
- 22 and the public members].
- SECTION 10. Section 114.010, Human Resources Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 25 (d) Funds shall be appropriated from available resources to
- 26 allow the council to fund services and activities serving people
- 27 with autism or related pervasive developmental disorders in this

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- 1 state.
- 2 SECTION 11. Section 114.011(c), Human Resources Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (c) The council shall develop with the <u>Health and Human</u>
- 5 <u>Services Commission and any agency designated by the commission</u>
- 6 [Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation]
- 7 procedures for allocating available funds to programs approved
- 8 under this section.
- 9 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
