- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) In this section:
- 7 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services

- 9 (2) "Health and human services agencies" has the
- 10 meaning assigned by Section 531.001, Government Code.
- 11 (3) "Training for child protective services" means
- 12 training administered by a state agency or an institution of higher
- 13 education that is provided to individuals working or interested in

- 16 effectively or efficiently.
- 17 (b) The commission shall study the feasibility of providing
- 18 a financial incentive to individuals to assist the individuals in
- 19 receiving training for child protective services.
- 20 (c) The study must:
- 21 (1) consider the feasibility of creating a private
- 22 foundation to solicit and receive money that will be used to assist
- 23 those individuals;
- 24 (2) consider possible means of providing a financial

- 1 incentive, including educational or living stipends or
- 2 reimbursement of tuition costs, to assist those individuals and
- 3 determine the most effective means to deliver the incentives;
- 4 (3) suggest criteria that those individuals must meet
- 5 to receive the financial incentives;
- 6 (4) estimate the initial cost and annual cost to this
- 7 state of providing the financial incentives to those individuals;
- 8 and
- 9 (5) estimate the savings and costs associated with
- 10 improved training of those individuals that may result from
- 11 providing the financial incentives.
- 12 (d) In conducting the study under Subsection (b) of this
- 13 section, the commission may cooperate as necessary with any
- 14 appropriate state agency.
- 15 (e) Not later than September 1, 2006, the commission shall
- 16 report the results of the study to the standing committees of the
- 17 senate and house of representatives with primary jurisdiction over
- 18 health and human services programs or appropriations.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
