A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of clinical nutritionists and nutrition 3 consultants; providing penalties. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subtitle M, Title 3, Occupations Code, 5 is 6 amended by adding Chapter 703 to read as follows: CHAPTER 703. CLINICAL NUTRITIONISTS AND NUTRITION CONSULTANTS 7 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 8 Sec. 703.001. GENERAL DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 9 "Department" means the Texas Department of Health. 10 (1)"Institution of higher education" has the meaning 11 (2) assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code. 12 13 (3) "Nutritionists board" means the Texas State Board 14 of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists. (4) "Nutrition consulting" means the recommendation 15 of a diet, including specific foods, and the recommendation of 16 lifestyle changes to prevent disease and optimize health. 17 Sec. 703.002. DEFINITION OF CLINICAL NUTRITION. 18 (a) In this section: 19 (1)"Nutritional assessment" means the evaluation of 20 individual nutritional needs, recognizing biochemical 21 22 individuality, to determine factors necessary to restore or 23 maintain healthy physiological function. The term includes the use 24 of appropriate tests and observations interpreted in terms of

optimal values and nutrition and lifestyle analysis to determine an
 appropriate nutritional program, including:

3 (A) a case history;

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(B) anthropometric measurements;

5 (C) physical signs; and

6 (D) biochemical data, including specialty 7 nutritional laboratory tests of blood, urine, saliva, and feces.

8 (2) "Nutritional supplements" includes food, 9 vitamins, minerals, botanicals, nutraceuticals, amino acids, trace 10 elements, biochemical supplements, homeopathics, macronutrients, 11 micronutrients, herbs, accessory food factors, and metabolites 12 designed to correct clinical deficiencies in the human body.

(3) "Whole food" means a food in its naturally grown
state, prepared for human consumption with minimum or no processing
and preserving.

16 (b) "Clinical nutrition" means a specialization in 17 nutrition that requires advanced training, including training in:

18 (1) the interpretation of nutrition assessments for19 the evaluation of nutritional status; and

(2) recommendations for therapeutic intervention to
 correct identified nutritional imbalances using specific whole
 foods, nutritional supplements, and other nutrition consulting.

Sec. 703.003. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas State board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the nutritionists board is abolished and the chapter expires September 1, 2017.

[Sections 703.004-703.050 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF CLINICAL NUTRITIONISTS

3 Sec. 703.051. NUTRITIONISTS BOARD; MEMBERSHIP. (a) The
4 Texas State Board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists consists
5 Of nine members appointed by the governor as follows:

6 (1) six members who are clinical nutritionists who 7 hold a license issued under this chapter and who have been licensed 8 under this chapter for at least the three years preceding 9 appointment to the nutritionists board; and

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(2) three members who represent the public.

(b) Appointments to the nutritionists board shall be made without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin of the appointee.

nutritionists 14 (c) In appointing clinical to the 15 nutritionists board, the governor shall attempt to maintain a 16 continuing balance of representation among the clinical, research, management, and educational areas of expertise in clinical 17 18 nutrition.

Sec. 703.052. ELIGIBILITY OF PUBLIC MEMBERS. A person may not be a public member of the nutritionists board if the person or the person's spouse:

(1) is registered, certified, or licensed by a
regulatory agency in the field of clinical nutrition;

(2) is employed by or participates in the management
 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or
 receiving money from the nutritionists board;

27 (3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more

1 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other 2 organization regulated by or receiving money from the nutritionists 3 board; or

4 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
5 goods, services, or funds from the nutritionists board, other than
6 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for nutritionists
7 board membership, attendance, or expenses.

Sec. 703.053. MEMBERSHIP AND EMPLOYEE RESTRICTIONS. 8 9 (a) In this section, "Texas trade association" means a cooperative and voluntarily joined statewide association of business or 10 11 professional competitors in this state designed to assist its members and its industry or profession in dealing with mutual 12 13 business or professional problems and in promoting their common 14 interest.

(b) A person may not be a member of the nutritionists board and may not be a board employee employed in a "bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity," as that phrase is used for purposes of establishing an exemption to the overtime provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), and its subsequent amendments, if:

(1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a Texas trade association in a field regulated by the nutritionists board; or

(2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid
 consultant of a Texas trade association in a field regulated by the
 nutritionists board; or

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(c) A person may not be a member of the nutritionists board

or act as the general counsel to the nutritionists board if the 1 2 person is required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305, 3 Government Code, because of the person's activities for 4 compensation on behalf of a profession related to the operation of 5 the nutritionists board.

6 Sec. 703.054. TERMS. Members of the nutritionists board 7 serve staggered six-year terms, with three member's terms expiring 8 on February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

9 Sec. 703.055. GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL FROM NUTRITIONISTS BOARD. 10 (a) It is a ground for removal from nutritionists board that a 11 member:

12 (1) does not have at the time of appointment the 13 qualifications required by Section 703.051;

14 (2) does not maintain during service on the 15 nutritionists board the qualifications required by Section 16 703.051;

17 (3) is ineligible for membership under Section 703.05218 or 703.053;

(4) cannot, because of illness or disability dischargethe member's duties for a substantial part of the member's term; or

(5) is absent from more than half of the regularly scheduled nutritionists board meetings that the member is eligible to attend during a calendar year without an excuse approved by a majority vote of the nutritionists board.

(b) The validity of an action of the nutritionists board is not affected by the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a nutritionists board member exists.

(c) If the executive director has knowledge that a potential 1 2 ground for removal exists, the executive director shall notify the presiding officer of the nutritionists board of the potential 3 4 ground. The presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for removal exists. If 5 the potential ground for removal involves the presiding officer, 6 the executive director shall notify the next highest ranking 7 officer of the nutritionists board, who shall then notify the 8 9 governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for 10 removal exists.

Sec. 703.056. PER DIEM; REIMBURSEMENT. (a) Each member of the nutritionists board is entitled to receive a per diem at the rate set by the legislature for state employees in the General Appropriations Act for each day the member engages in the business of the nutritionists board.

16 (b) A member is entitled to reimbursement for 17 transportation expenses as provided by the General Appropriations 18 Act.

Sec. 703.057. FIXED SALARY PROHIBITED. A nutritionists board member may not receive a fixed salary for the member's services.

22 Sec. 703.058. OFFICERS. (a) The governor shall designate 23 a member of the nutritionists board as the presiding officer of the 24 board to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the governor.

(b) The nutritionists board shall elect an assistant presiding officer from its membership as provided by nutritionists board rule.

Sec. 703.059. MEETINGS. The nutritionists board shall hold
 at least two regular meetings each year as provided by rules adopted
 by the nutritionists board.

Sec. 703.060. TRAINING. (a) A person who is appointed to and qualifies for office as a member of the nutritionists board may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of the nutritionists board until the person completes a training program that complies with this section.

9 (b) The training program must provide the person with 10 information regarding;

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(1) this chapter;

12 (2) the programs operated by the nutritionists board;

13 (3) the role and functions of the nutritionists board;
14 (4) the rules of the nutritionists board, with an

emphasis on the rules that relate to disciplinary and investigatory authority;

17 (5) the current budget for the nutritionists board;
18 (6) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
19 nutritionists board;

(7) the requirements of:

21 (A) the open meetings law, Chapter 551,
22 Government Code;

(B) the public information law, Chapter 552,
 Government Code;

(C) the administrative procedure law, Chapter26 2001, Government Code; and

(D) other law relating to public officials,

1 including conflict-of-interest laws; and

2 (8) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
3 nutritionists board or the Texas Ethics Commission.

4 (c) A person appointed to the nutritionists board is 5 entitled reimbursement, provided by the to as General 6 Appropriations Act, for the travel expenses incurred in attending 7 the training program regardless of whether the attendance at the program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office. 8

9 Sec. 703.061. USE OF TECHNOLOGY. The nutritionists board 10 shall develop and implement a policy requiring the executive 11 director and nutritionists board employees to research and propose 12 appropriate technological solutions to improve the nutritionists 13 board's ability to perform its functions. The technological 14 solutions must:

(1) ensure that the public is able to easily findinformation about the nutritionists board on the Internet;

17 (2) ensure that persons who want to use the 18 nutritionists board's services are able to:

(A) interact with the nutritionists boardthrough the Internet; and

(B) access any service that can be provided
 effectively through the Internet; and

(3) be cost-effective and developed through thenutritionists board's planning processes.

25 Sec. 703.062. NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING AND ALTERNATIVE 26 DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCEDURES. (a) The nutritionists board shall 27 develop and implement a policy to encourage the use of:

1 (1) negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 2 2008, Government Code, for the adoption of nutritionists board 3 rules; and

4 (2) appropriate alternative dispute resolution procedures under Chapter 2009, Government Code, to assist in the 5 internal and external 6 resolution of disputes under the 7 nutritionists board's jurisdiction.

The nutritionists board's procedures relating 8 (b) to 9 alternative dispute resolution must conform, to the extent 10 possible, to any model guidelines issued by the State Office of Administrative Hearings for the use of alternative 11 dispute resolution by state agencies. 12

13 (c) The nutritionists board shall designate a trained 14 person to:

15 (1) coordinate the implementation of the policy 16 adopted under Subsection (a);

17 (2) serve as a resource for any training needed to 18 implement the procedures for negotiated rulemaking or alternative 19 dispute resolution; and

20 (3) collect data concerning the effectiveness of those
 21 procedures, as implemented by the nutritionists board.

23 SUBCHAPTER C. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND PERSONNEL

24 Sec. 703.001. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. The nutritionists board 25 shall employ an executive director.

26 Sec. 703.102. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR POWERS AND DUTIES. In 27 addition to other duties prescribed by this chapter and by the

1 department, the executive director shall:

2 (1) administer licensing activities for the 3 nutritionists board;

4 (2) keep full and accurate minutes of the transactions
5 and proceedings of the nutritionists board;

6 (3) serve as custodian of the files and records of the 7 nutritionists board;

8 (4) prepare and recommend to the nutritionists board 9 plans and procedures necessary to implement the purposes and 10 objectives of this chapter, including rules and proposals on 11 administrative procedures;

12 (5) exercise general oversight of persons employed by13 the department in the administration of this chapter;

14 (6) investigate complaints and present formal 15 complaints;

16 (7) attend all meetings of the nutritionists board as 17 a nonvoting participant;

18 (8) handle the correspondence of the nutritionists19 board; and

20 (9) obtain, assemble, or prepare reports and
21 information as directed or authorized by the nutritionists board.

Sec. 703.103. PERSONNEL AND FACILITIES. (a) The department shall provide the basic personnel and facilities required to administer this chapter. The department personnel administering this chapter act as agents of the nutritionists board.

27 (b) The department by agreement may secure services as it

1 considers necessary to administer this chapter and provide 2 compensation for those services.

3 (c) The department may employ, on a full-time or part-time 4 basis, the professional consultants, technical assistants, and 5 employees necessary to administer this chapter.

6 Sec. 703.104. DIVISION OF RESPONSIBILITIES. The 7 nutritionists board shall develop and implement policies that 8 clearly separate the policymaking responsibilities of the 9 nutritionists board and the management responsibilities of the 10 executive director and the staff of the nutritionists board.

11 Sec. 703.105. QUALIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT INFORMATION. The executive director or the executive director's 12 designee shall provide to members of the nutritionists board and to 13 board employees, as often as necessary, information regarding the 14 15 requirements for office or employment under this chapter, including 16 information regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable laws relating to standards of conduct for state officers or 17 18 employees.

Sec. 703.106. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY POLICY; REPORT. (a) The executive director or the executive director's designee shall prepare and maintain a written policy statement that implements a program of equal employment opportunity to ensure that all personnel decisions are made without regard to race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin.

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(b) The policy statement must include:

(1) personnel policies, including policies relating
 to recruitment, evaluation, selection, training, and promotion of

1 personnel, that show the intent of the nutritionists board to avoid 2 the unlawful employment practices described by Chapter 21, Labor 3 Code, and

4 (2) an analysis of the extent to which the composition 5 of the nutritionists board's personnel is in accordance with state 6 and federal law and a description of reasonable methods to achieve 7 compliance with state and federal law.

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(c) The policy statement must:

be updated annually;

10 (2) be reviewed by the Texas Workforce Commission for11 compliance with Subsection (b)(1); and

(3) be filed with the governor's office.

13 Sec. 703.107. STATE EMPLOYEE INCENTIVE PROGRAM. The 14 executive director or the executive director's designee shall 15 provide to nutritionists board employees information and training 16 on the benefits and methods of participation in the state employee 17 incentive program.

18 [Sections 703.108-703.150 reserved for expansion]

19 SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES

20 Sec. 703.151. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF NUTRITIONISTS21 BOARD. The nutritionists board shall:

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(1) adopt and publish a code of ethics; and

(2) establish the qualifications and fitness of
 applicants for licenses, including renewal and reciprocal
 licenses.

26 Sec. 703.152. GENERAL RULEMAKING AUTHORITY. (a) The 27 nutritionists board may adopt rules consistent with this chapter.

1 (b) In adopting rules, the nutritionists board shall 2 consider the rules and procedures of the Texas Board of Health and 3 the department and shall adopt procedural rules consistent with 4 similar rules and procedures of those entities.

5 Sec. 703.153. RULES RESTRICTING ADVERTISING OR COMPETITIVE 6 BIDDING. (a) The nutritionists board may not adopt a rule 7 restricting advertising or competitive bidding by a person 8 regulated by the nutritionists board except to prohibit a false, 9 misleading, or deceptive practice.

10 (b) In its rules to prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive11 practices, the nutritionists board may not include a rule that:

12 (1) restricts a person's use of any medium for 13 advertising;

14 (2) restricts a person's personal appearance or voice15 in an advertisement;

16 (3) relates to the size or duration of an 17 advertisement by a person; or

18 (4) restricts a person's advertisement under a trade19 name.

Sec. 703.154. FEES. After consulting the commissioner of public health or the department, the nutritionists board by rule shall set fees in amounts reasonable and necessary to cover the cost of administering this chapter.

24 Sec. 703.155. MONEY. (a) The department shall account for 25 money received under this chapter.

(b) The department shall deposit all money received underthis chapter to the credit of the licensed clinical nutritionists

1 account in the general revenue fund. Money in the account may be 2 appropriated only to the department for administration of this 3 chapter.

4 Sec. 703.156. SEAL. (a) The nutritionists board by rule 5 may require a license holder to:

6 (1) obtain a seal authorized by the nutritionists 7 board, bearing the license holder's name and the legend "Licensed 8 Clinical Nutritionist" or "Licensed Nutrition Consultant"; and

9 (2) affix the seal to formal documentation of 10 nutrition services provided by the license holder.

(b) If the nutritionists board adopts rules under Subsection (a), the rules must require a license holder to comply with Subsection (a)(2) by maintaining a facsimile of the license holder's seal on file at the location where services are provided if:

16 (1) the services are provided:

17 (A) in a facility licensed under the Health and18 Safety Code;

(B) on behalf of a local, state, or federalgovernment agency; or

(C) under other circumstances determined
 reasonable and necessary by the nutritionists board; and

(2) the facsimile is maintained on file at all timesduring which services are provided.

25 Sec. 703.157. POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD OF HEALTH. To 26 implement this chapter, the Texas Board of Health:

27 (1) shall request and receive any necessary assistance

1 from state institutions of higher education or other state
2 agencies;

3 (2) shall prepare information of consumer interest 4 describing the regulatory functions of the nutritionists board, the 5 procedures by which consumer complaints are filed and resolved, and 6 the profession of clinical nutrition;

(3) shall prepare a list of persons holding licenses
under this chapter, including the type of license held, and make the
information available to the public, license holder, and
appropriate state agencies; and

(4) may require the attorney general or the appropriate county or district attorney to sue to enjoin a violation of this chapter in addition to any other action, proceeding, or remedy authorized by law.

 16 SUBCHAPTER E. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION
 17 AND COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

18 Sec. 703.201. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION. (a) The 19 nutritionists board shall prepare information of public interest 20 describing the functions of the nutritionists board and the 21 nutritionists board's procedures by which complaints are filed with 22 and resolved by the nutritionists board.

(b) The nutritionists board shall make the informationavailable to the public and appropriate state agencies.

25 Sec. 703.202. CONTACT INFORMATION. (a) The nutritionists 26 board by rule shall establish methods by which consumers and 27 service recipients are notified of the name, mailing address, and

1 telephone number of the nutritionists board for the purpose of 2 directing complaints to the nutritionists board. The nutritionists 3 board may provide for that notification:

4 (1) on each license form, application, or written
5 contract for services of a person regulated by the nutritionists
6 board;

7 (2) on a sign prominently displayed in the place of
8 business of each person regulated by the nutritionists board; or

9 (3) in a bill for services provided by a person 10 regulated by the nutritionists board.

(b) The nutritionists board shall list along with its regular telephone number the toll-free complaint line utilized by the various boards and programs to report a complaint about a health professional.

Sec. 703.203. RECORDS OF COMPLAINT. (a) The nutritionists board shall maintain a file on each written complaint filed with the nutritionists board. The file must include;

18 (1) the name of the person who filed the complaint;
19 (2) the date the complaint is received by the
20 nutritionists board;

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(3) the subject matter of the complaint;

(4) the name of each person contacted in relation to the complaint;

(5) a summary of the results of the review orinvestigation of the complaint; and

26 (6) an explanation of the reason the file was closed,27 if the nutritionists board closed the file without taking action

1 other than to investigate the complaint.

2 (b) The nutritionists board shall provide to the person 3 filing the complaint and to each person who is a subject of the 4 complaint a copy of the nutritionists board's policies and 5 procedures relating to complaint investigation and resolution.

6 (c) The nutritionists board, at least quarterly until final 7 disposition of the complaint, shall notify the person filing the 8 complaint and each person who is a subject of the complaint of the 9 status of the complaint unless the notice would jeopardize an 10 undercover investigation.

11 (d) The nutritionists board shall review a complaint 12 regarding:

(1) incompetency, misconduct, gross negligence, fraud, misrepresentation, or dishonesty in the performance of the functions or duties of a license holder; and

16 (2) the use of any controlled substance or drug or the 17 use of alcoholic beverages to an extent that the use impairs a 18 person's ability to perform the work of a clinical nutritionist.

Sec. 703.204. GENERAL RULES REGARDING COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION AND DISPOSITION. (a) The nutritionists board shall adopt rules concerning the investigation of a complaint filed with the nutritionists board. The rules adopted under this subsection shall:

(1) distinguish between categories of complaints;
(2) ensure that a complaint is not dismissed without
appropriate consideration;

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(3) require that the nutritionists board be advised of

1 a complaint that is dismissed and that a letter be sent to the 2 person who filed the complaint explaining the action taken on the 3 dismissed complaint;

4 (4) ensure that the person who filed the complaint has
5 an opportunity to explain the allegations made in the complaint;
6 and

7 (5) prescribe guidelines concerning the categories of 8 complaints that require the use of a private investigator and the 9 procedures for the nutritionists board to obtain the services of a 10 private investigator.

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(b) The nutritionists board shall:

(1) dispose of each complaint in a timely manner; and

13 (2) establish a schedule for conducting each phase of 14 a complaint that is under the control of the nutritionists board not 15 later than the 30th day after the date the complaint is received by 16 the nutritionists board.

(c) Each party to the complaint shall be notified of the projected time requirements for pursuing the complaint. Each party shall be notified of any change in the schedule established under Subsection (b)(2) not later than the seventh day after the date the change is made.

(d) The executive director shall notify the nutritionists board of a complaint that is not resolved in the time prescribed by the nutritionists board for resolving the complaint so that the nutritionists board may take necessary action on the complaint.

26 Sec. 703.205. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. The nutritionists 27 board shall develop and implement policies that provide the public

1 with a reasonable opportunity to appear before the nutritionists 2 board and to speak on any issue under the jurisdiction of the 3 nutritionists board.

4 Sec. 703.206. EXCEPTION TO OPEN RECORDS LAW FOR CERTAIN 5 COMPLAINT AND INVESTIGATION RECORDS. (a) Except as provided in 6 Subsection (b), information or material subpoenaed or compiled by 7 the nutritionists board in connection with a complaint and 8 investigation:

9 (1) is confidential and not subject to disclosure 10 under Chapter 552, Government Code; and

(2) is not subject to disclosure, discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for its release to anyone other than the nutritionists board or its employees or agents involved in discipline of the license holder.

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(b) The information may be disclosed to:

16 (1) a person involved with the nutritionists board in
17 a disciplinary action against the license holder;

18 (2) a professional clinical nutritionist licensing or
19 disciplinary board in another jurisdiction;

(3) a peer assistance program approved by the
nutritionists board under Chapter 467, Health and Safety Code;

(4) a law enforcement agency; or

(5) a person engaged in bona fide research, if all
 individual-identifying information has been deleted.

26	SUBCHAPTER F. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS
27	Sec. 703.251. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not

1 practice clinical nutrition or nutrition consulting in the state 2 for compensation unless the person is licensed as provided by this 3 chapter, or exempted as provided by this chapter.

Sec. 703.252. EXEMPTIONS. (a) In this section, "license"
means a license, certificate, registration, title, or permit issued
in this state

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(b) This chapter does not prohibit or restrict:

8 (1) a person from using a title allowed by state law in9 the field of nutrition;

10 (2) a person from conducting a class, seminar, or 11 other speech related to nutrition;

(3) a person from providing free oral nutrition 12 information as an operator or employee of a health food store or 13 sells health products, 14 business that including dietary 15 supplements, food, or food materials, or distributing written nutrition information in connection with the marketing and 16 17 distribution of those products;

18 (4) free nutritional instruction by members of a
 19 religious or faith-based organization using a ministry of natural
 20 healing; or

(5) a person from distributing free information related to nutrition if that person does not violate Section 703.251(b).

24 (c) This chapter does not prohibit or restrict the practice25 of:

(1) a person licensed in this state to engage in thepractice for which the person is licensed, including a dietician

1 licensed under Chapter 701;

2 (2) clinical nutrition by a person who is performing
3 official duties as a United States employee;

4 (3) clinical nutrition by a cooperative extension home
5 economist, to the extent the activities are part of the economist's
6 employment;

7 (4) clinical nutrition or dietetics by a person
8 pursuing a course of study leading to a degree in dietetics,
9 nutrition science, or an equivalent major, as authorized by the
10 department and from a regionally accredited school or program, if:

11 (A) the activities and services are part of a 12 supervised course of study; and

(B) the person is designated by a title that
clearly indicates the person's status as a student or trainee;

15 (5) clinical nutrition or dietetics by a person 16 fulfilling the supervised practice experience component of a 17 nutrition or dietetics program;

(6) clinical nutrition or dietetics by a person with a
master's or doctorate degree with a major in nutrition, or an
equivalent major, from a regionally accredited school recognized by
the department for the purpose of education and research;

(7) clinical nutrition by an educator employed by a nonprofit organization, as authorized by the department or any other governmental entity; or

(8) clinical nutrition by a person who provides weightcontrol services.

27 Sec. 703.253. LICENSE APPLICATION. (a) Each applicant for

1 a license must submit a sworn application, accompanied by the 2 application fee. The applicant must specify the type of license for 3 which the person is applying.

4 (b) The nutritionists board shall prescribe the application form and may by rule establish dates by which applications and fees 5 must be received. The rules must be consistent with department 6 7 rules related to application dates of other licenses or registrations. 8

9 Sec. 703.254. EXAMINATION. (a) An applicant must pass a 10 competency examination approved by the nutritionists board for each 11 type of license to qualify for that license under this chapter. The 12 board shall offer an examination for each type of license at least 13 twice a year.

(b) The nutritionists board shall prepare each examination or adopt an examination prepared or given by an approved scientific nutritionists board of clinical nutritionist experts or an approved testing service. Any written portion of an examination must be validated by an independent professional testing agency.

Sec. 703.255. QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXAMINATION. (a) To qualify for the licensed clinical nutritionist examination, an applicant must:

(1) possess a baccalaureate or postbaccalaureate degree conferred by an accredited institution of higher education, with:

(A) a major course of study approved by the
 nutritionists board in human nutrition, nutrition, or nutrition
 education; or

(B) an equivalent major course of academic study
 approved by the nutritionists board; and

3 (C) hold a current post graduate specialty 4 credential in clinical nutrition from a nutritionist board approved 5 certifying entity; or

6 (D) hold an advanced degree in clinical nutrition 7 or nutrition science from a board approved academic institution; 8 and

9 (2) have completed an internship of preplanned, 10 documented, professional experience program in clinical nutrition practice of not less than 900 hours under the supervision of a 11 licensed clinical nutritionist or 12 licensed а physician, chiropractor, or dentist who holds credentials approved by the 13 nutritionists board in the field of clinical nutrition. 14

(b) To qualify for the licensed nutrition consultantexamination, an applicant must:

(1) possess at least a two-year vocational degree in the nutrition sciences or other course of study approved by the nutritionists board; and

(2) have completed an internship of not less than nine
months under the supervision of a licensed clinical nutritionist or
other practitioner approved by the nutritionists board.

Sec. 703.256. INVESTIGATION. (a) Not later than the 45th day after the date a properly and timely submitted application is received and not later than the 30th day before the next examination date, the department shall notify an applicant in writing of the receipt and investigation of the applicant's application and any

other relevant evidence relating to applicant qualifications
 established by nutritionists board rule.

3 (b) The notice must state whether the applicant has 4 qualified for examination based on the application and other 5 submitted evidence. If the applicant has not qualified, the notice 6 must state the reasons for the applicant's failure to qualify.

Sec. 703.257. EXAMINATION RESULTS. (a) Not later than the 30th day after the date a person takes a licensing examination under this chapter, the nutritionists board shall notify the person of the results of the examination.

(b) If the examination is graded or reviewed by an approved scientific nutritionists board of clinical nutritionist experts or a testing service:

14 (1) the nutritionists board shall notify the person of 15 the results of the examination not later than the 14th day after the 16 date the nutritionists board receives the results from the board of 17 experts or testing service; and

18 (2) if notice of the examination results will be 19 delayed for longer than 90 days after the examination date, the 20 nutritionists board shall notify the person of the reason for the 21 delay before the 90th day.

(c) The nutritionists board may require the board of experts or a testing service to notify a person of the results of the person's examination.

(d) If requested in writing by a person who fails an
examination under this chapter, the nutritionists board shall
furnish the person with an analysis of the person's performance on

1 the examination.

Sec. 703.258. REEXAMINATION. An applicant who fails the examination three times must provide evidence to the nutritionists board that the applicant has successfully completed clinical nutrition or nutrition consultant training in the applicant's areas of weakness before the applicant may apply for reexamination.

Sec. 703.259. QUALIFIED PERSON ENTITLED TO LICENSE. The
 nutritionists board shall issue the appropriate clinical
 nutritionist or nutrition counselors license under this chapter to
 a person who meets the qualifications of the license.

Sec. 703.260. TEMPORARY LICENSE. (a) The nutritionists board may issue the appropriate temporary license to an applicant currently licensed in another jurisdiction who seeks a license in this state and who:

(1) has been licensed in good standing as a clinical nutritionist or nutrition counselor for at least two years in another jurisdiction, including a foreign country, that has licensing requirements substantially equivalent to the requirements of this chapter;

(2) has passed a national or other examination
 recognized by the nutritionists board relating to the practice of
 clinical nutrition or nutrition consulting; and

(3) is sponsored by a person licensed by the
nutritionists board under this chapter with whom the provisional
license holder will practice during the time the person holds a
provisional license.

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(b) The nutritionists board may waive the requirement of

Subsection (a)(3) for an applicant if the nutritionists board
 determines that compliance with that subsection would be a hardship
 to the applicant.

4 (c) A temporary license is valid until the date the 5 nutritionists board approves or denies the temporary license 6 holder's application for a license. The nutritionists board shall 7 issue a license under this chapter to the temporary license holder 8 if:

9 (1) the temporary license holder is eligible to be 10 licensed under Section 703.263; and

(A) the nutritionists board verifies that the temporary license holder meets the academic, professional and experience requirements for a license under this chapter; and

(B) the temporary license holder satisfies anyother licensing requirements under this chapter.

(d) The nutritionists board must approve or deny a temporary license holder's application for a license not later than the 180th day after the date the temporary license is issued. The nutritionists board may extend the 180-day period if the results of an examination have not been received by the nutritionists board before the end of that period.

(e) The nutritionists board may establish a fee for a temporary licenses in an amount reasonable and necessary to cover the cost of issuing the license.

25 Sec. 703.261. PROVISIONAL LICENSE. (a) On receipt of an 26 application and payment of an application fee, the nutritionists 27 board may grant the appropriate provisional license to an applicant

1 who:

2 (1) is sponsored by a person licensed by the 3 nutritionists board under this chapter with whom the provisional 4 license holder may practice; and

5 (2) Is waiting on a graduating university to send 6 official transcripts, or

7 (3) an internship sponsor to complete internship8 documentation.

9 (b) The nutritionists board may waive the requirement of 10 Subsection (a)(3) if the nutritionists board determines that 11 compliance with that provision is a hardship to the applicant.

(c) A provisional license is valid until the date the nutritionists board approves or denies the provisional license holder's application for a license. The nutritionists board shall issue a license under this chapter to the holder of a provisional license if:

17 (1) the provisional license holder passes the18 competency examination required by Section 703.254;

19 (2) the nutritionists board verified that the 20 provisional license holder meets the academic, professional and 21 experience requirements for a license under this chapter; and

(3) the provisional license holder satisfies any otherlicense requirements under this chapter.

(d) The nutritionists board must complete the processing of
a provisional license holder's application for a license not later
than the 180th day after the date the nutritionists board issues the
provisional license. The nutritionists board may extend this

1 deadline to receive pending examination results.

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2 Sec. 703.262. INACTIVE STATUS. The nutritionists board by 3 rule may provide for a license holder to place the person's license 4 on inactive status. The nutritionists board by rule shall provide 5 for a time limit for a license to remain on inactive status.

6 Sec. 703.263. RECIPROCITY. The nutritionists board may 7 waive any prerequisite to obtaining a license for an applicant who 8 holds a license issue by another jurisdiction with which this state 9 has a reciprocity agreement. The nutritionists board may make an 10 agreement, subject to the approval of the governor, with another 11 state to allow for licensing by reciprocity.

SUBCHAPTER G. LICENSE RENEWAL; CONTINUING EDUCATION

Sec. 703.301. LICENSE RENEWAL. The nutritionists board shall renew the license of a clinical nutritionist or nutrition consultant in good standing who:

17 (1) returns a completed renewal form in the manner18 prescribed by the nutritionists board;

19 (2) submits evidence of completion of the minimum 20 number of continuing education hours required under Section 21 703.305; and

(3) pays the required renewal fee before the licenseexpires.

24 Sec. 703.302. TERM OR LICENSE. A license is valid for two 25 years after the date of issuance and may be renewed annually.

26 Sec. 703.303. LICENSE RENEWAL PROCEDURE. (a) A person who 27 is otherwise eligible to renew a license may renew an unexpired

1 license by paying the required renewal fee to the nutritionists 2 board before the license expiration date. A person whose license 3 has expired may not engage in activities that require a license 4 until the license has been renewed.

5 (b) A person whose license has been expired for 90 days or 6 less may renew the license by paying to the nutritionists board a 7 renewal fee that is equal to 1-1/2 times the normally required 8 renewal fee.

9 (c) A person whose license has been expired for more than 90 10 days but less than one year may renew the license by paying to the 11 nutritionists board a renewal fee that is equal to two times the 12 normally required renewal fee.

13 (d) A person whose license has been expired for one year or 14 more may not renew the license. The person may obtain a new license 15 by complying with the requirements and procedures for obtaining an 16 original license.

(e) A person who was licensed in this state, moved to another state, and is currently licensed and has been in practice in the other state for the two years preceding the date of application may obtain a new license without reexamination. The person must pay to the nutritionists board a fee that is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee for the license.

(f) Not later than the 30th day before the date a person's license is scheduled to expire, the nutritionists board shall send written notice of the impending expiration to the person at the person's last known address according to the records of the nutritionists board.

1 Sec. 703.304. STAGGERED RENEWAL OF LICENSES. The 2 nutritionists board by rule may adopt a system under which licenses 3 expire on various dates during the year. On renewal of the license 4 on the new expiration date, the total license renewal fee is 5 payable.

6 Sec. 703.305. CONTINUING EDUCATION. (a) To renew a 7 license under this chapter:

8 (1) a licensed clinical nutritionist must annually 9 complete at least 25 hours of continuing education approved by the 10 nutritionists board; including hours from at least one clinical 11 nutritionist scientific symposium approved by the nutritionists 12 board.

(2) a licensed nutrition consultant must annually complete at least 17 hours of continuing education approved by the nutritionists board, including hours from at least one clinical nutritionist symposium approved by the nutritionists board.

17 (b) The nutritionists board may assess the continuing 18 education needs of license holders and may require license holders 19 to attend continuing education courses specified by the board and 20 made available by continuing education providers approved by the 21 nutritionists board. The nutritionists board shall develop a 22 process to evaluate and approve continuing education.

(c) The nutritionists board shall identify the key factors for the competent performance of professional duties. The nutritionists board shall adopt a procedure to assess a license holder's participation in continuing education programs.

[Sections 703.306-703.350 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER H. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER

3 Sec. 703.351. DISPLAY OF LICENSE. (a) Each license holder 4 shall display the person's license in an appropriate and public 5 manner.

6 (b) A license issued by the nutritionists board is the 7 property of the nutritionists board and must be surrendered on 8 demand.

9 Sec. 703.352. LICENSE HOLDER INFORMATION. A license holder 10 shall keep the department informed of the license holder's current 11 address.

Sec. 703.353. PROHIBITED USE OF SEAL. (a) A person may not use a seal authorized by the nutritionists board unless the person holds a license under this chapter.

(b) A person may not affix a seal to a document if the license of the license holder named on the license is expired, suspended, or revoked.

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19 SUBCHAPTER I. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

20 Sec. 703.401. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. (a) The 21 nutritionists board shall revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a 22 license or shall reprimand a license holder for a violation of this 23 chapter, a rule of the nutritionists board, or a code of ethics 24 adopted by the nutritionists board.

(b) The nutritionists board shall have the right to use emergency suspension when the alleged violation is sufficient to warrant emergency action.

Sec. 703.402. HEARING. (a) If the nutritionists board
 proposes to suspend or revoke a person's license, the person is
 entitled to a hearing.

4 (b) A member or employee of the nutritionists board or a employee who carries out the functions of 5 department the 6 nutritionists board and who proposes to make a decision, a finding 7 of fact, or a conclusion of law in a proceeding pending before the nutritionists board may communicate directly or indirectly with a 8 9 party to the proceeding or with the party's representative only if 10 notice and an opportunity to participate are given to each party.

Sec. 703.403. SCHEDULE OF SANCTIONS. The State Office of Administrative Hearings shall use the schedule of sanctions adopted by the nutritionists board by rule for a sanction imposed as the result of a hearing conducted by the office.

Sec. 703.404. PROBATION. The nutritionists board may place on probation a person whose license is suspended. If a license suspension is probated, the nutritionists board may require the person:

19 (1) to report regularly to the nutritionists board on20 matters that are the basis of the probation;

(2) to limit practice to the areas prescribed by the nutritionists board; or

(3) to continue or receive professional education until the person attains a degree of skill satisfactory to the nutritionists board in those areas that are the basis of the probation.

27 Sec. 703.405. MONITORING OF LICENSE HOLDER. (a) The

nutritionists board by rule shall develop a system for monitoring a
 license holder's compliance with this chapter.

3 (b) Rules adopted under this section must include 4 procedures to:

5 (1) monitor for compliance a license holder who is 6 ordered by the nutritionists board to perform certain acts; and

7 (2) identify and monitor license holders who represent8 a risk to the public.

9 Sec. 703.406. APPLICABILITY OF OPEN RECORDS LAW ТО 10 DISCIPLINARY RECORDS. The filing of formal charges by the nutritionists board against a license holder, the nature of those 11 charges, disciplinary proceedings of the board, and final 12 disciplinary actions, including warnings and reprimands, are not 13 confidential and are subject to disclosure in accordance with 14 15 Chapter 552, Government Code.

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[Sections 703.407-703.450 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER J. CIVIL PENALTY

Sec. 703.451. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates this chapter or a rule adopted by the nutritionists board under this chapter is liable to the state for a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 for each day of violation.

(b) At the request of the nutritionists board, the attorney general shall bring an action to recover a civil penalty authorized by this section.

25 SECTION 2. (a) Until September 1, 2007, the Texas State 26 Board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists shall waive the 27 examination required under Chapter 703, Occupations Code, as added

by this Act, and issue a license under that chapter to any person who holds a credential in good standing for clinical nutritionist or other nutrition specialty status issued by a nationally recognized professional certification entity approved by the Texas State Board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists.

Until September 1, 2007, the Texas State Board of 6 (b) 7 Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists shall waive the education requirements for the clinical nutritionist examination, but not the 8 9 examination, required under Sections 703.254 and 703.255, 10 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, for any person who is a 11 licensed physician, chiropractor, dentist, pharmacist, or registered nurse. 12

(c) Until September 1, 2007, the Texas State Board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists shall waive the education requirements for the nutrition consultant examination, but not the examination, required under Sections 703.254 and 703.255, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, and issue a license under that chapter to any person who:

(1) presents evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has at least five years of documented experience in the field of nutrition consulting approved by the board; or

(2) holds a certificate in good standing in basic or entry-level nutrition issued by a nationally recognized certification entity approved by the board.

25 SECTION 3. (a) The governor shall appoint the initial 26 members of the Texas State Board of Examiners of Clinical 27 Nutritionists not later than December 1, 2005. In making the

initial appointments, the governor shall designate two clinical nutritionist appointees and one public appointee for terms expiring February 1, 2007, two clinical nutritionist appointees and one public appointee for terms expiring February 1, 2007, and two clinical nutritionist appointees and one public appointee for terms expiring February 1, 2011.

7 (b) A person appointed as a clinical nutritionist member of the Texas State Board of Examiners of Clinical Nutritionists before 8 9 September 1, 2009, is not required to be licensed for three years as 10 required by Section 703.051(a)(1), Occupations Code, as added by 11 this Act, but the person must be eligible to hold a license issued under that chapter, may not have an additional primary practice, 12 and must have at least three years of professional experience in the 13 field of clinical nutrition. 14

15 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 16 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

(b) Section 703.251 and Subchapters I and J, Chapter 703,
Occupations Code, as added by this Act, take effect January 1,
2006.
