## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to organizing certain data collected by the Department of

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 104, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 104.044 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 104.044. SORTING COLLECTED DATA. (a) The department
8	shall compile the health data collected under this subchapter and
9	organize the results, to the extent possible, according to the
10	following geographic areas:
11	(1) the Texas-Mexico border region;
12	(2) each public health region;
13	(3) rural areas;
14	(4) urban areas;
15	(5) each county; and
16	(6) the state.
17	(b) Health data released under this subchapter must be
18	released in accordance with the way it is compiled under this
19	section.
20	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 191, Health and Safety
21	Code, is amended by adding Section 191.008 to read as follows:
22	Sec. 191.008. SORTING COLLECTED DATA. (a) The department
23	shall compile the information relating to births, deaths, and fetal
24	deaths collected under this chapter and organize the results, to

1	the extent possible, according to the following geographic areas:
2	(1) the Texas-Mexico border region;
3	(2) each public health region;
4	(3) rural areas;
5	(4) urban areas;
6	(5) each county; and
7	(6) the state.
8	(b) The department may release the information relating to
9	births, deaths, and fetal deaths in accordance with the way it is
10	compiled under this section.
11	SECTION 3. The Department of State Health Services shall
12	consult with a group of affected persons and entities to define
13	rural and urban areas for purposes of Sections 104.044 and 191.008,
14	Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, including:
15	(1) individuals with expertise in rural health
16	services research, epidemiology, rural public health services
17	delivery, demography, health planning, and large data sets; and
18	(2) representatives from universities, the Department
19	of State Health Services, the Office of Rural Community Affairs,
