## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	the	authority	of	the	Department	of	Public	Safety	of	the
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- 3 State of Texas or the public safety director to adopt rules in
- 4 connection with commercial motor vehicles.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subsections (a) and (b), Section 644.053,
- 7 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A rule adopted under this chapter may not:
- 9 (1) prevent an intrastate operator from operating a 10 vehicle up to 12 hours following eight consecutive hours off;
- 11 (2) require a person to meet the medical standards
- 12 provided in the federal motor carrier safety regulations if the
- 13 person:

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- 14 (A) was regularly employed in this state as a
- 15 commercial motor vehicle operator in intrastate commerce before
- 16 August 28, 1989; and
- 17 (B) is not transporting property that requires a
- 18 hazardous material placard;
- 19 (3) require a person who returns to the work-reporting
- 20 location, is released from work within 12 consecutive hours, has at
- 21 <u>least eight consecutive hours off between each 12-hour period the</u>
- 22 person is on duty, and operates within a 150-air-mile radius of the
- 23 normal work-reporting location to maintain a driver's record of
- 24 duty status as described by 49 C.F.R. Section 395.8, provided that

- 1 the person maintains time records in compliance with 49 C.F.R.
- 2 Section 395.1(e)(5) and documents that verify the truth and
- 3 accuracy of the time records such as [government form, separate
- 4 company form, operator's record of duty status, or operator's daily
- 5 log for operations within a 150-mile radius of the normal
- 6 work-reporting location if a general record of an operator's hours
- 7 of service can be compiled from]:
- 8 (A) business records maintained by the owner that
- 9 provide the date, time, and location of the delivery of a product or
- 10 service; or
- 11 (B) documents required to be maintained by law,
- 12 including delivery tickets or sales invoices, that provide the date
- of delivery and the quantity of merchandise delivered; or
- 14 (4) impose during a planting or harvesting season
- 15 maximum driving and on-duty times on an operator of a vehicle
- 16 transporting an agricultural commodity in intrastate commerce for
- 17 agricultural purposes from the source of the commodity to the first
- 18 place of processing or storage or the distribution point for the
- 19 commodity, if the place is located within 150 air miles of the
- 20 source.
- (b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(3)(A), an owner's  $\underline{\text{time}}$
- 22 [business] records must at a minimum [generally] include:
- 23 (1) the time an operator reports for duty each day;
- 24 (2) the number of hours an operator is on duty each
- 25 day;
- 26 (3) the time an operator is released from duty each
- 27 day; and

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- 1 (4) an operator's signed statement in compliance with
- 2 49 C.F.R. Section 395.8(j)(2).
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
